## Patterson, Johansson Signing Due

Tickets for the Craterian theatre presentation of the Floyd Patterson - Ingemar Johansson world heavy-weight title boxing bout are now on sale at the theatre.

The bout is scheduled for Thursday, June 25, at Yankee stadium.

There will be no home revision of the fight.

Tickets for the Craterian showing that night can be purchased daily at the theatre from 9 a.m. until noon, 1 to 3 p.m. and 6:30 to 8:30 p.m.

New York - (AP) - Floyd Patterson and Ingemar Johansson are slated to sign official contracts at headquarters of the New York State Athletic Commission Tuesday for their June 25 heavyweight title fight.

When they signed their original private contracts with promoter Bill Rosenzohn on Jan. 29, the site for their 15-round bout had not been selected.

And, at that time, Johansson had no license to fight in New York state, and Rosenzohn had no license to promote here.

After Yankee Stadium was picked for the site, both the Swedish challenger and Rosenzohn got their licenses.

In announcing Tuesday's ceremony, the commission apparently figures that Federal Judge Irving R. Kaufman will not announce his decision in the Johansson-Edde Machen suit until Wednesday or later.

Trial of the suit was completed last Friday and Judge Kaufman reserved decision.

Machen of Redding, Calif., sued to restrain Johansson from fighting Patterson or anyone else before he carried out a return-bout agreement.

The agreement was made last Sept. 13, the day before Johansson knocked out Machen in the first round at Goteborg, Sweden. Ingemar claimed the agreement was invalid for several reasons.

## Pancho Segura Becomes Masters

Los Angeles - (UPI) - Defending champion Pancho Segura held a two-game edge in the Masters round robin tennis championships today as the competitors got their only rest in the nine-day event.

Segura, of Los Angeles, had a 4-0 mark after three days of play in the \$15,000 round robin at the Los Angeles Tennis Club.

Behind him is Pancho Gonzales, winner of his match with Lew Hoad that the experts figured would be the key to the championship.

Gonzales in his only singles appearance topped Hoad, 11-6, 10-8 Saturday night in a typical battle of the big serve. They are old rivals from the Jack Kramer pro tour.

But while Hoad and Gonzales shared the spotlight, Segura went on piling up points.

Segura has beaten Ashley Cooper, Frank Segman and Ken Rosewall.

# Wilhelm's Ninth Victory Takes Orioles Into Second

Hoyt Wilhelm already has made believers of American league hitters and now the Baltimore Orioles are trying to do the same with the experts.

Wilhelm's 9-0 record and astounding 0.99 earned run average speak for themselves and Manager Paul Richards insists the Orioles' second-place standing ought to do the same.

"We can go all the way," Richards has been preaching since the start of the season. "We'll go as far as our pitching will take us."

Well, Sunday Wilhelm's pitching took the Orioles into second place via a 3-0 victory over the Kansas City Athletics. The erstwhile ragamuffins of the league are only one game behind the first-

place Chicago White Sox and area half-game ahead of the third-place Cleveland Indians both of whom split their Sunday doubleheaders.

The White Sox scored a 9-4 victory in their opener but lost the nightcap to the Boston Red Sox 4-2 and the Yankees bounced back from a 7-5 setback to beat the Indians, 4-3, before 59,823 at Cleveland. The Detroit Tigers made it 23 out of 33 under Jimmy Dykes with a 6-4 win over the Washington Senators.

In the National league, the Milwaukee Braves increased their first-place margin to two games by beating the Los Angeles Dodgers, 8-2. The Chicago Cubs beat the Pittsburgh Pirates, 4-2 and 1-0, the St. Louis Cardinals downed the Philadelphia Phillies, 2-0, after an 11-9 defeat and the

Cincinnati Reds defeated the San Francisco Giants, 7-1, after a 5-3 setback.

Gus Triandos hit a two-run homer and Billy Klaus singled home Baltimore's other run as Wilhelm scored his third shutout.

The White Sox routed Ike Delock with six runs in the second inning and went on to win the opener with a 12-hit attack that gave Dick Donovan his third victory. The Red Sox, however, tagged Billy Pierce for three runs in the first inning of the nightcap and Frank Sullivan held the White Sox scoreless until the ninth when Leo Kiely and Mike Fornieles bailed him out.
