### Olympic Bid Plan Told

Washington — (UPI) — Nationalist China will try to regain a place in the 1960 Olympic Games under a new name, "The Olympic Committee of the Republic of China."

That action was predicted by Nationalist Chinese Ambassador George K. Yeh during a television interview with Rep. Harold C. Osterlag (R-N.Y.). The new Chinese application must be approved by the International Olympic Committee (IOC).

The IOC recently ousted Nationalist China from membership on the grounds that the Chinese committee does not rule sports in all of China. It said the Nationalists could apply for readmission as representatives merely of Formosa.
