Wall Street has said right along that steel shares would do better if a strike came than if one were averted. New highs were set by Jones & Laughlin, Wheeling, Inland, and Carpenter Steel. U.S. Steel rose more than 2 points as did Youngstown Sheet & Tube. Lukens rose 3 1/2 points. Gains of more than a point appeared in the others.

Aluminum shares moved up fractions to 2 points in Alcoa. Several of the electronics issues moved higher with Motorola up more than 2.

# Steel Committee Authorizes Steps

New York—(UPI)—The steel union's International Wage Policy Committee today authorized the union's officers "to take whatever steps they deem necessary" to deal with the contract deadlock. David J. McDonald, president of the USW, said the 171-man committee angrily rejected an industry proposal to modify its wage freeze if the union accepts eight changes in the contract. McDonald said that committee members "hooted and howled" at the industry's suggestion that they give up certain protections in the contract. McDonald told reporters the committee's action authorizes him to shut down the mills if no new contract exists at the strike deadline July 1.
