The Medical Roundup

A Loud Heart Murmur
I get so many letters from people, letters that distress me because I cannot possibly

give a logical or helpful answer. For instance, a woman is terribly distressed because her physician found that her son of 18 has a heart murmur. She wants to know whether the lad should be taken to one of the great clinics, or if she should search out the best heart specialist in the country, or whether she should have the boy's heart operated on. She wants my advice. I can't give a word of advice unless I know if the lad is sick or incapacitated. Perhaps he isn't sick at all; the lady forgot to tell me. Many people go through life with a loud murmur and no symptoms or disability. I saw one such man who was still working hard when he was 76.

Insurance for Mental Illness.
Dr. D. J. McKerracher recently reminded a group of men interested in group health insurance that, although patients with mental illness fill half of our hospital beds, no one sells insurance against this type of disease. Worse yet, as Dr. McKerracher said, we doctors are very slow to recognize what is going wrong with the man who for months or a year is slipping into a mental upset. We keep giving him tranquilizers, and often we operate on him.

Today, some experts in group insurance are beginning to feel that people should be insured against mental illness. If such patients only could be treated quickly and expertly, when their nerves begin to crack, many cures soon could be worked and then the expense would not be prohibitive. Dr. McKerracher said that if a person who has become mentally upset could go quickly into a good hospital and be wisely treated, he could be out in a matter of weeks.

Units Being Built
A good place for him would be in one of the new "psychiatric units" in a general hospital. Such units are now being built in many cities, and they promise to be the most important factor in improving mental health in this country.
