

# The Wedding Procession



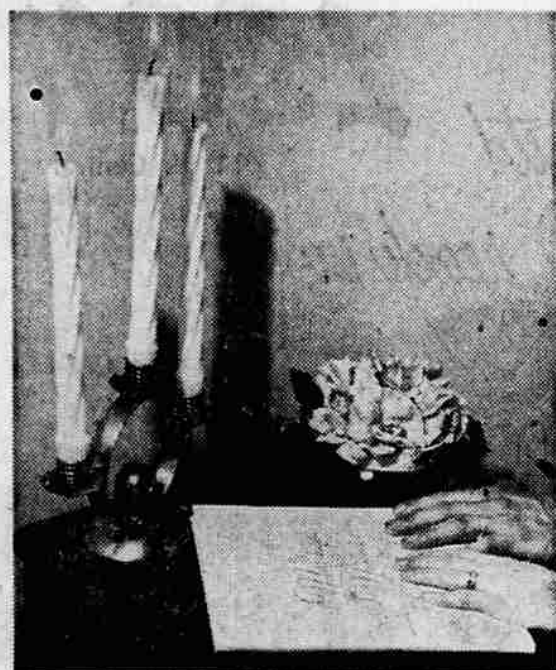
