Illness Invades Wagon Train in Hills of Wyoming

Rawlins, Wyo. — Illness invaded the Oregon wagon train Saturday night, forcing Mrs. Lowell Blair, 57, to return to her home in Sheridan, Ore.

Mrs. Blair, suffering from an acute asthmatic condition aggravated by the extreme elevation in Central Wyoming where the Oregon Trail crosses the Continental Divide, said it became impossible to continue further.

Boards Train

She was rushed from the wagon train's week end campsite near Sweetwater Station to Rawlins, 100 miles away, by the train's news director, Ivan Hoyer.

She boarded a train for Oregon and said she will seek medical treatment in Portland and will stay with her son, Gene Blair, until she recovers.

Mr. Blair will remain on the wagon train and will continue to drive the Lane county wagon.

Mrs. Blair is the first person on the caravan to be forced to leave the trip. Other members of the cavalcade expressed sadness at losing her and presented her with a gift of \$100 when she left.

She said she will try to rejoin the train when it reaches Pendleton about Aug. 1.

Burning Permits Required; Fires In Jacksonville

Jacksonville — Three fires were reported to Jacksonville Volunteer firemen Saturday between 1:50 and 3:30 p.m.

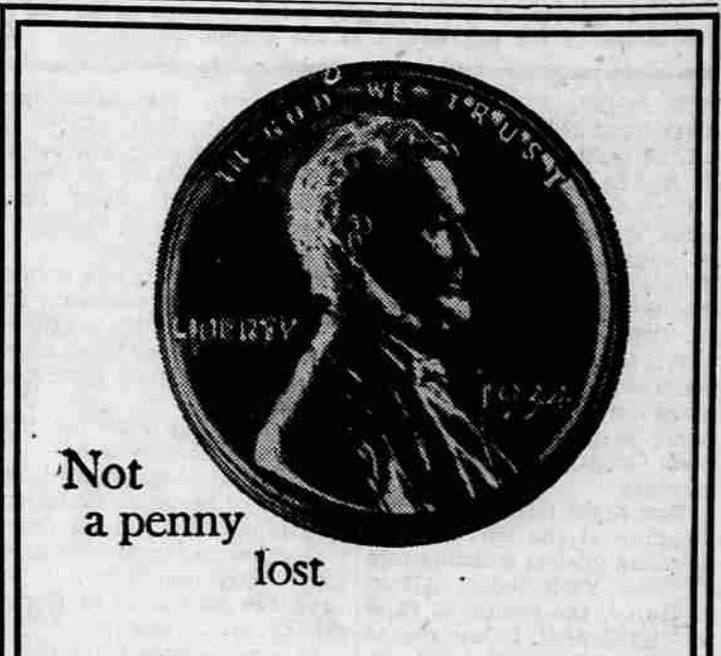
Two of the fires were grass fires. One, which burned 1/2 acre, was started by trash burning, it was explained, and was at 704 Sterling rd. The other fire, on the Paul Bulkin property at the end of South Oregon rd. was caused by a spark from the first fire, firemen reported. The entire lot was burned.

The second fire, at 2:28 p.m. was at the boarding house of Mrs. Alice Hibbert, 105 South Third st., and was confined to a mattress in a room occupied by Roy Mitchell. Smoke damage was reported in other rooms of the home.

Firemen believe the fire was started by a cigarette.

Fire Chief Lewis Applebaker reported that no open burning is allowed within the city limits without a permit. He said that violators would be fined. Permits are also necessary for burning in incinerators. These may be obtained from Police Chief Frank Carter after the incinerator is inspected.

The fire chief also requested residents to turn off irrigation water when they hear the fire siren. Residents are also reminded to clean up fire hazards on their property.
