The Lindleys are former residents of southern Oregon. She is the former Lucille Hittle.

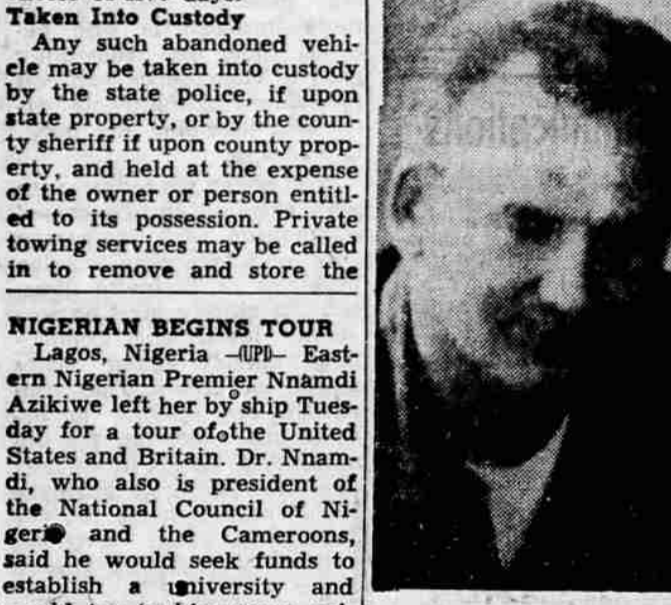

Abandoned Vehicles to Be Removed by State

Salem - The maintenance division of the state highway department has been requested to cooperate with Oregon state police in the removal of abandoned or derelict vehicles found on state highways or state property, as provided in state laws. Reason for the state highway engineer's request is that such abandoned vehicles occasionally have no salvage value resulting in no private towing company being available to remove the derelict. Oregon law provides that no vehicle shall be parked or left standing upon the right of way of any county road or state highway outside the corporate limits of incorporated cities or towns, or upon any state property, for a period in excess of five days. Taken Into Custody Any such abandoned vehicle may be taken into custody by the state police, if upon state property, or by the county sheriff if upon county property, and held at the expense of the owner or person entitled to its possession. Private towing services may be called in to remove and store the

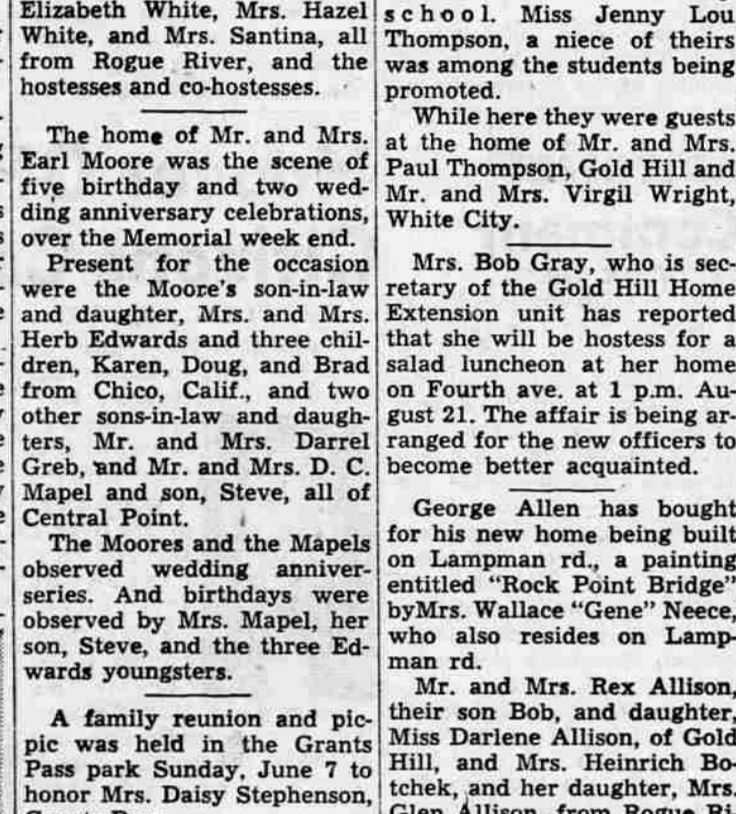

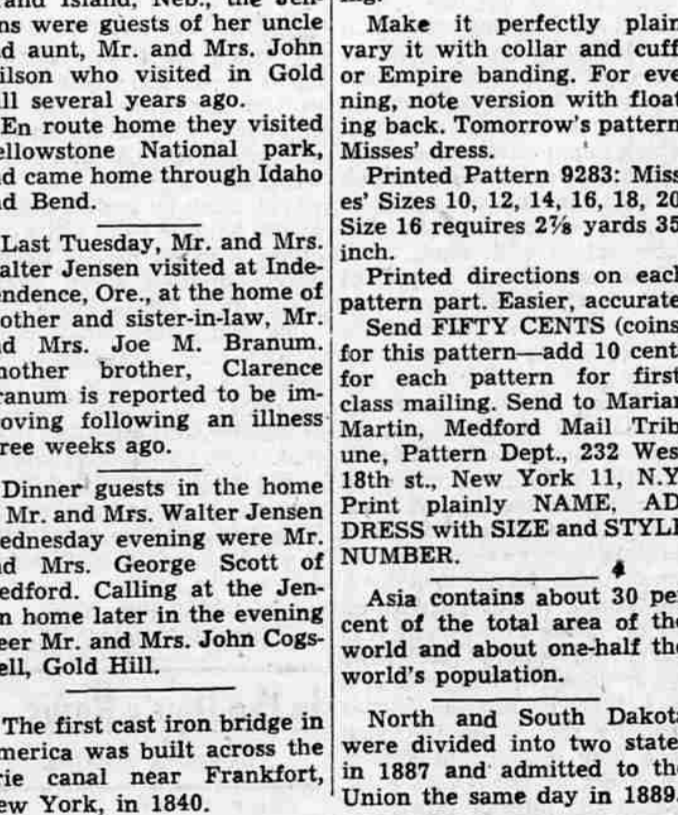
New Yorker To Head Musicians Union
