

### Morse May Seek Smaller Dunes Park

Washington—UPI—Sen. Wayne Morse (D-Ore.) indicated Tuesday that he may attempt to have the size of the Oregon dunes national seashore area made smaller than proposed by Sen. Richard Neuberger (D-Ore.).

The proposed bill was introduced in March by Neuberger with Morse as co-sponsor. The bill would authorize up to 35,000 acres for the park which would include the dunes and Sea Lion Caves.

Morse said that he might have several amendments to offer after public hearings are held later in the year in the area. The senior senator indicated that he was troubled by discretionary authority granted to the secretary of the interior in the pending bill.

### Governor Long May Be Removed To Louisiana

Galveston, Tex.—UPI—Gov. Earl Long of Louisiana was expected to be taken back to Louisiana today from a Texas mental hospital where he has been held for more than two weeks against his will.

Reliable sources said the governor's wife, who with his cousin, Dr. Arthur Long, brought him to John Sealy hospital in Galveston, would fly from Baton Rouge, La., today to obtain his release. Called "Horse Doctor"

It was Dr. Long whom the governor called a "horse doctor" at a habeas corpus hearing Monday in which he tried to get out of the hospital on the ground he was being held illegally. District Judge L. D. Godard postponed a decision until next Monday.

Mrs. Long, or her Texas attorneys, will go before Probate Judge Hugh Gibson and withdraw a petition for commitment she and Dr. Long filed when the governor was committed on May 30, it was reported.

Long, 63, was seen Tuesday night packing his bags on the second floor of the hospital's psychiatric ward. Guards kept newsmen from talking to him. May Resume Position

Sen. Russell Long the governor's nephew, and Dr. Long conferred with psychiatrists at John Sealy Tuesday and expressed the fear that if the governor were returned to Louisiana he would try to resume his position as chief executive behind hand-picked state troopers and armed National Guardsmen.

If this happened, it would be virtually impossible to serve the governor with any kind of court order confining him or committing him for treatment inside his own state.

### Spree Ended for Killer Brothers

Middleboro, Mass.—UPI—One of the cop killing Coyle brothers was shot and killed and the other surrendered to police today.

William Coyle, 22, younger of the notorious Philadelphia brothers, was shot 10 times in a 90 second gun battle with police. He was taken to St. Luke's Hospital in Middleboro, where he died while undergoing emergency surgery.

John Coyle, 24, gave up when his brother fell in the exchange of gunfire on the edge of a cranberry bog.

He was taken to state police barracks here for questioning.

The gun battle climaxed a three day manhunt, one of the biggest in Massachusetts history.

The battle beneath murky skies in this southeastern Massachusetts community ended the crime spree of the brothers that included the killing of a Philadelphia policeman June 4.

### Opposition To Georgia School Integration Told

Atlanta—UPI—Georgia lawmakers voiced opposition today to a federal court order directing the Atlanta school board to prepare a plan for public school integration. The order set no deadline.

U.S. District Judge Frank Hooper specified that the desegregation plan must be ready "within a reasonable time." He said he would allow the Georgia legislature time to study whatever plan is submitted before ordering it into effect.

Hooper, in a final decree, said continued operation of schools "with discrimination as in the past will not be permitted."

Georgia House Floor Leader Frank Twitty expressed serious doubt that the legislature would consider any plan that would allow a county to integrate its schools.

"I think that the sentiment among the great majority of the members of the legislature is to keep the laws we have now," he said.

Sen. Richard B. Russell urged the Atlanta school board to resist "this effort of the itinerant lawyers of the colored people association."

Sen. Herman Talmadge, Gov. Ernest Vandiver and other state segregation leaders declined to comment, but Atlanta Mayor William Hartsfield said Hooper's ruling allows "time for both the city and state to save our public schools." Hartsfield long has advocated a local option plan to meet the integration crisis.

The judge said he recognized that the city is bound by state laws which call for the automatic closing of any integrated school.

"In cases such as this a solution must be found for the particular conditions which exist," Hooper said.
