Certainly no President in recent years has cared less about whiskey. This is relatively unusual in the sophisticated cocktail society of a world capital.

Left to his own devices, Eisenhower might take a thin scotch and water before dinner, but that is about all. He doesn't drink beer.

### Seven Drivers Get Licenses Suspended

Salem—The department of motor vehicles has released names of 330 drivers whose licenses were ordered suspended during the period beginning June 8, and ending June 12.

Length of suspension varies, depending on charges involved, recommendation of court, discretionary action by the department or requirements of Oregon law. The department said some of the licenses involving court recommendations may have been re-instated after suspension was ordered.

The department warned drivers that the penalty for driving while suspended is a jail sentence of no less than two days and up to six months, and there may be imposed a fine up to \$500. Under licensing procedures, this will also result in an additional year of suspension.

There have been numerous occasions where the President deliberately delayed his arrival in order to reach the banquet just in time for dinner, leaving the hosts with a fine collection of unopened bottles.

Eisenhower would not think of having a drink before lunch as many big American executives do. Nor does he drink after dinner—unless it is a most unusually festive evening as Christmas or New Year's, or when he is the guest of a president or king in some foreign setting where to turn down a drink might seem out of place.

### Greeted Friend

As casual as the President is about his own taste in highballs, he's very perceptive when it comes to spotting someone who may have overindulged slightly.

At a rather large party not too long ago, Eisenhower was greeted by a man he knows well. The cocktail session before dinner had been running an hour or more when the President arrived.

With a broad grin and no hint of accusation, the President said in a voice that could be heard quite distinctly in other parts of the room, "Well, by jolly, I'd say you've been drinking."

The somewhat flabbergasted guest responded with what passed for a smile and said,

"I'd say that you're right, Mr. President."
