

Tenant Rescued In Portland Fire

Portland—UPF—A 58-year-old man was saved by three firemen in an early morning Portland apartment house fire Friday.

Earl Walker, of Portland, was carried in a semi-conscious state from his flaming room in the Edenholm Apartments.

Firemen Bob Hodges and Jim Dietz entered the blazing fourth-floor room and carried the dazed occupant to the window where he was carried down an aerial ladder by fireman Charles Gray.

Another fireman, Chester Runyan fought heavy smoke to alert tenants of the top floor—many of whom were still in bed when the fire broke out about 7 a.m.

All 46 tenants of the four-story, frame building were evacuated.

Walker was taken to a Portland hospital suffering from third degree burns on his head, neck, arms, and feet.

Flames were confined to the victim's room, which was gutted. Damage was estimated at \$3,000.

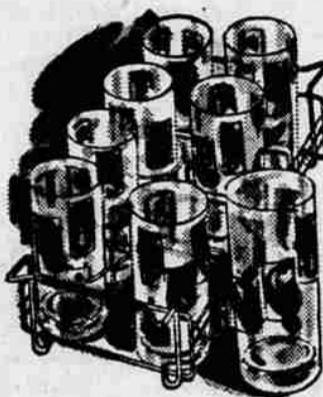
