

# Hatfield Names Labor Group Trio

Salem—Gov. Mark Hatfield has named his three members of the Labor-Management Relations Legislative Interim committee.

Hillman Lueddemann Sr., Portland, was designated by Hatfield to represent the state's business life; A. F. Zimmerman, Portland, Brotherhood of Locomotive Engineer, was named for labor; and Richard Jones, professor of history at Reed college, was named to represent the general citizenry.

Lueddemann and Jones are Republicans, Zimmerman a Democrat.

Legislative members are Sens. Harry Boivin, Klamath Falls; Dan Dimick, Roseburg; Walter Pearson, Portland; and Reps. William Gallagher, Portland; Edward Whelan, Portland; and Robert Duncan, Medford.

## The Medical Roundup

### When Death Comes To a Farmer

At a recent meeting of the American College of Surgeons, Dr. Charles W. McGee, of the University of Nebraska Medical School pointed out that because of often fatal accidents, farming is the third most dangerous type of work in this country. Mining is the most dangerous—with 120 deaths per 100,000 men exposed; construction work is second, with 80 deaths, and farming is third, with 60 deaths. Thirty-eight per cent of the farm accidents involve tractors; and other serious injuries are produced by corn-pickers and hay-balers. I have seen a number of farmers who had a hand badly torn in a corn-picker, and I have heard of many a man whose tractor "bucked" and fell over on top of him.

### An Important Body Substance Synthesized

One of the most important achievements in biological chemistry has been the recent chemical synthesis of a complex substance which is extremely important to the body, because it is needed by every cell of every living thing. It is called coenzyme A. Its synthesis was described by Dr. John Moffatt and H. Gobind Khorana, of the University of British Columbia. The chemical contains an elaborate arrangement of carbon, sulfur, nitrogen, phosphorus, oxygen and hydrogen atoms. Part of coenzyme A is pantothenic acid, a valuable growth factor which is part of the vitamin B complex. The synthesis of such a large molecule gives us hope that, before long, other extremely important drugs may be synthesized—drugs which now can be obtained only from animals.

## Green Charges Union Pressure

Washington—(UPI)—Rep. Edith Green (D-Ore.) Saturday charged that Teamster union agents of President Jimmy Hoffa have tried to intimidate her on the labor reform legislation question.

She said pressure exerted on her by a Teamsters lawyer, Sidney Zagri, were "questionable and uncalled for."

Although the House Labor committee member did not elaborate, other committee members have charged Zagri with "exerting sustained and naked pressure" to trim the Kennedy-Irvin bill of points that Hoffa doesn't like, or to kill the labor-reform measure altogether.

The committee is considering the Senate-approved bill. Mrs. Green said Teamster pressure had "no effect" on her stand that solid anti-racketeering labor legislation "must be passed in this session of Congress."

## Benton County Judge To Resign

Corvallis (UPI)—Benton County District Judge Richard Mengler has submitted his resignation to Gov. Mark Hatfield, effective Sept. 1.

He said he has accepted a position as associate professor of business administration at Oregon State college, and will teach law. Mengler is the first Benton county district judge. He was elected to the post when it was created Jan. 1, 1954.

His successor, to be named by the governor, will stand election in the 1950 primaries. The job pays \$9,000 a year. Judge Mengler currently is president of the Oregon Association of District Judges.
