

Mantle, Ford Pace Yanks In 10-2 Victory Over KC

Casey's finally making his move - just as he said he would - and it must delight the old boy that he even called the turn on the two men who would help him do the moving.

The two, of course, are Mickey Mantle and Whitey Ford.

"We'll be all right," Casey Stengel told the worried Yankee brass when the club hit rock-bottom a month ago. "We'll be all right as soon as Mantle starts hitting again

and I can get Ford to go nine."

So it certainly comes as no surprise to Stengel that his Yankees are back in the first division again, only two games away from the top, now that Mantle and Ford are beginning to click again.

Mantle cracked out his third homer in two days Tuesday night and Ford turned in a nifty five-hitter to pace the Yanks to a 10-2 victory over the Athletics.

White Sox Climb
The White Sox climbed to within a game of first place

with a 4-1 victory over the Senators; the Orioles moved to within a game-and-a-half of the top by beating the league-leading Indians, 5-1, and the Red Sox knocked the Tigers out of the first division with a 10-4 win.

In the National league, the Braves stretched their lead to two games by clipping the Cardinals, 9-5, while the Pirates licked the second-place Giants, 5-1. The Dodgers edged the Phillies, 4-3, and the Cubs topped the Reds, 3-1.

Early Wynn of the White Sox became the first AL pitcher to win 10 games when he halted the Senators on eight hits, one of which was Bob Allison's 19th homer.

Young Milt Pappas of the Orioles picked up his seventh victory by holding the Indians to five hits. Pappas blanked the Tribe until Woodie Held hit his 12th homer in the eighth.

Copple Has 146 Card in NCAA Mix

Eugene - (UP) - Fourteen college golfers from the Pacific Northwest, led by Tom Jakobsen of Oregon and Leighton Tuttle of Oregon State, qualified for the NCAA match play championships which start today.

Oregon, which finished in fourth place in team standings with a six-over-par 574, qualified five men. Seattle and Oregon State had three each, Idaho two and Washington State one.

Washington, which entered six men, failed to qualify one for the finals. The best Husky score was a 75-75-150 by Jim Shapiro, one short of the necessary 149 to qualify. The University of Portland also failed to qualify anyone.

Houston Gains Unprecedented 4th Straight NCAA Golf Toga

Eugene, Ore. - (UP) - Five members of University of Houston's six-man golf team led a field of 64 players today as match play opened in the NCAA Golf Tournament.

Houston won an unprecedented fourth straight team title Tuesday with Bob Pratt and Jack Cupit both tying the NCAA medalist record of 136 for 36 holes. Houston also set a new team mark of 561, nine strokes under the record it set last year and seven strokes under par.

Match play will run through Saturday, with today's field slated to be cut to 16 after two 18-hole match rounds.

Purdue finished 10 strokes back of Houston Tuesday to take second place in the team standings. Stanford was third with 573, Oregon fourth with 574, Oklahoma State fifth with 579 and Seattle sixth with 581.

Jakobsen One Stroke Back

Twelve players matched or broke par out of the field of 140.

Tom Jakobsen, fifth ranking player on the Oregon squad, shot a 68-69-137 yesterday to finish one stroke behind Pratt and Cupit.

Leighton Tuttle of Oregon State, whose 67 tied Cupit's second round for the best 18 of the day, and Ron Royer of Indiana shot 138s. Pratt had a 66-70, and Cupit a 69-67.

Jon Konsek of Purdue, last year's finalist behind Houston's Phil Rodgers, shot a 141 along with Bob Snelling and Ron Preston of Stanford.

Gene Francis of Purdue and Bill Warner of Seattle matched par at 142.

Other teams scorings included: Florida and Texas Tech 586, Rawlins 587, Duke 592, Oregon State 593, Iowa 595, Yale, 600, Idaho 603, North Texas State 607, Tulsa 608, Princeton and San Jose State 609, Washington 613, and Portland 618.
