

## Compensation Payments May Be Retroactive

Compensation payments for service-connected disabilities may be allowed retroactively as of three different dates.

1. Brannock, contact representative, VA Domiciliary, Camp White, said today.

The dates are determined by three different sets of circumstances, with the date application for compensation is filed being a factor in each case.

Brannock listed the dates as follows:

1. If the veteran files his application within a year from the date of his release from active service, and if VA finds the service-connected disability was severe enough at separation to be compensable, payment may be made retroactive to the day following his release.

2. If the veteran files application within a year from the date of his release, but his disability was not severe enough at release to be compensable, payments may not be made for periods earlier than the date the evidence shows the disability became severe enough to be compensable.

3. If the veteran files his application later than one

## State Files Suit For Fire Damage

Klamath Falls - The state of Oregon and the Klamath Forest Protective association have filed suit in federal court for damages of \$27,150 against the United States as the result of a forest fire which burned valuable timber.

The fire was set Sept. 24, 1937, in the Bogus creek area in Siskiyou county, California, by the forest service. The complaint charges that employees of the forest service were negligent in permitting it to cross the state line.

The fire burned over several hundred acres of timberland in the Coppo area, and extended into Klamath county. The fire spread rapidly when unexpected winds whipped sparks into unburned area and out of the area circled by a fire line.
