

# Ralph Terry Appears Answer To NY Problem; Beats Orioles

Don't just stand there, do something — and now that Ralph Terry finally has Casey Stengel in convinced thinks are looking up for the Yankees.

"I gotta find me another pitcher before we can get back up there again," Casey has been saying all along.
