

Trash Pick-up Said 'Huge Success' Here

The last trash pick-up run for Medford's "clean-up" day Tuesday was completed Thursday, a city street department spokesman reported.

The "clean-up," slated for one day but lasting three because of the quantity of trash set out by residents for collection, was described by the spokesman as "a huge success."

City trucks reinforced by vehicles provided by City Sanitary Service covered the entire city, picking up refuse in connection with the "Make Medford Beautiful" campaign.

The trash has all been hauled to City Sanitary's dump near Jacksonville, where it is to be burned as soon as atmospheric conditions are suitable.

The Medical Roundup

What Women Want to Know
An excellent book for women with medical problems has recently been written by Dr. Harold M. Imerman and T. Blanchard Dewey (Crown Publishers).

In this book, an able gynecologist tells in simple, non-technical speech about a woman's womb, ovaries and tubes — and what may go wrong with these organs. He tells about child-bearing and the menopause, and the sexual changes that come to a woman with age.

When the Psychoanalyst Falls Asleep
Recently I found a delightful abstract from a book by two psychoanalysts, who seriously discuss the technic to be used by a psychoanalyst when he gets caught sound asleep behind the couch, and has to wriggle out of this jam. Naturally, he has to convince the patient that he did it on purpose, and in order the better to treat the neurosis.

I quote from the article: "It should not be necessary to clarify the fact that the therapist isn't being bored. Sleep does not signify either a positive or a negative relationship, but has certain specific dynamics. Sleep on the part of the therapist may serve as a retreat from the relationship, and an escape from his own anxiety. It may be a retreat from aggressive impulses or a yielding to sexual fantasies. A mature therapist will rapidly get past this phase and arrive at a point where going to sleep has a specific function, and serves the therapeutic relationship. Then sleep becomes a means by which he expresses non-verbally the deepest positive feeling, or negative feelings towards the patient. Obviously, the therapist must go beyond his own embarrassment at this socially unexpected pattern in human inter-relationships, before he can develop it as a technic to serve the patient." The editor adds, "and he'd better fix the fee before he goes beddy-bye."

Senate Votes Cut In Foreign Aid

Washington—UPB—The Senate voted Thursday to cut \$250 million dollars from its foreign aid bill. This brought it more in line with President Eisenhower's program.

It then defeated a move which would have ended all economic aid in three more years.

The actions came in rapid order as the Senate began voting on a long list of amendments to a bill to provide \$3,850,000,000 in military, economic and technical aid for the free world.
