Grading Begins At Site of New Academy Building

Grading work began Tuesday on the site of the new Rogue River Junior Academy on the school property on South Stage rd. Construction is being rushed in order to provide six rooms for use this fall. The old two-story building, which has been in use for over 30 years, was condemned last spring by the state fire marshal. Plans call for a \$125,000 unit when completed. An auditorium-gymnasium with a seating capacity of 1,000 will be added when the classroom needs are met. This will provide a central meeting place for various community activities. Building contractor for the new unit is George Johnson, Rogue River Junior Academy is a church school operated for students in the Rogue Valley by the Seventh-day Adventist churches.

In the Day's News

Over on the Williamson river Tuesday, Oregon's Governor Hatfield pushed a button that set in motion the multi-million dollar Johns-Manville plant that will supply the 11 Western states with a new type of building materials.

The gathered dignitaries at the opening ceremony listened attentively. For a moment, Bill Graham grinned and spoke into the mike. "They're just like your TV set," he said. "They have to warm up."

Over the loud speaker came the high hum of modern machinery gathering speed. The crowd in the new plant's pleasant little auditorium relaxed. The years of planning had come out all right. It was working.

IT WAS a momentous occasion, deserving a special page in the history of this part of the Far West.

Why so momentous? It marked the first commercial use of jackpine, the weed tree we had tried for a century to get rid of. There on the south bank of the Williamson yesterday, Cinderella of the Woods put on the golden slipper and it FITTED. She's on her way now.

JACKPINE cordwood goes in at one end of the plant. It is first debarked. The bark goes into a furnace to provide heat for the later processes. Even the squeal, to use an ancient crack of the meat-packing industry, is utilized.

Then it is pressed against Gargantuan grindstones that reduce it to pulp. The pulp moves in a steady, unbroken procession through complicated machine after complicated machine. At the other end, it comes out in a wide variety of materials useful in our modern building economy.

Third Cover Spray Needed on Pears

The third cover spray on pears should be completed 30 days before harvest to avoid residues in excess of tolerances, according to Dr. L. G. Gentner, entomologist at the Southern Oregon Experiment station, and County Horticultural Agent C. L. Cordy. Bartlett harvest will start about Aug. 5, and anjou harvest about Aug. 25.

Information on types and amounts of spray has been mailed to growers. Others wishing the information may call the agent's office.
