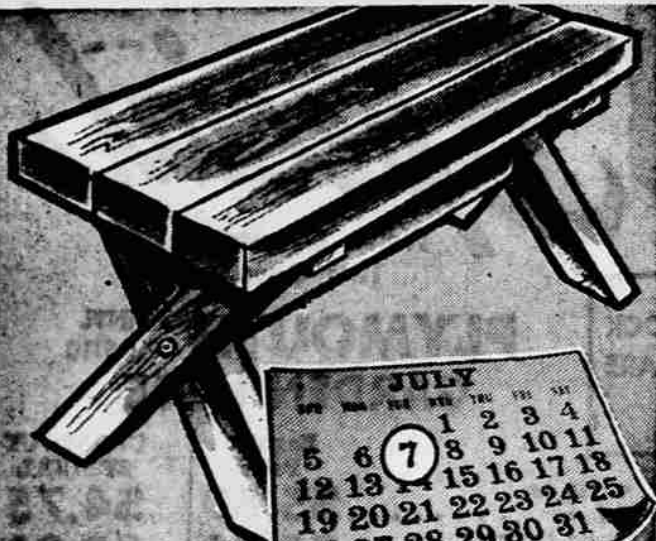

# In the Day's News

From Washington: Soviet First Deputy Premier Kozlov heads for California. . . He and his party will stop at Sacramento on the next leg of a flying swing around the nation. He is expected to continue his campaign to sell "peaceful coexistence" on Russian terms.

**WHAT are his tactics?**  
They're weird. For example:

Out of one side of his mouth, he promises NO WAR, NO WAR. He speaks mildly and reassuringly of peaceful coexistence.

Then, out of the other side of his mouth, he trumpets: "FORCE WILL BE MET WITH FORCE" if the situation in Berlin erupts into hostilities.

**WHAT'S he up to?**  
Take down your Shakespeare from your five-foot shelf. Turn to Midsummer-Night's Dream, Act I, Scene 2, in which a play is being cooked up for the Duke of Athens and his duchess and the actors are discussing the parts they will take.

There's a lion in the play. Bottom wants to play the part of the lion. He says: "I will roar, that I will do any man's heart good to hear me; I will roar, that I will make the duke say, 'Let him roar again, let him roar again!'"

Quince (who is doing the casting) is afraid Bottom might roar too realistically. He says: "An you should do it too terribly, that would fright the ladies, that they would shriek, and that were enough to hang us all." To which Bottom replies:

"I grant you, friends, if that you should fright the ladies out of their wits, they would have no more discretion but to hang us, but I will aggravate my voice so that I will roar you as gently as any suckling dove; I will roar as 'twere any nightingale."

**WHAT TELLS the tale.** Kozlov is playing the part of Bottom.

But—  
When he roars as gently as any suckling dove, how much reliance can we put in it?

The answer in short and simple: NONE!  
In the case of communist Russia, every agreement she has made has been broken at the first moment when it has suited her purposes to repudiate her solemn agreements. That's the long and the short of it.

**WHAT shall WE do about it?**

On this Fourth of July week end, I think it is fitting that we should go back for an answer to our Declaration of Independence, which opens with these words:

"When, in the course of human events, it becomes necessary for one people to

dissolve the political bands which have connected them with another, and to assume among the powers of the earth the separate and equal station to which the Laws of Nature and Nature's Gift entitle them, a decent respect for the opinions of mankind requires that they should declare the causes which impel them to the separation."

Our Declaration — one of the great documents of all mankind — closes with these ringing words:

"And for the support of this Declaration, with a firm reliance on the protection of Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other our Lives, our Fortunes and our Sacred Honor."

**WHAT'S what we did once before** — and it served us well.

Let's make it plain that if we have to we'll do it again. That's about all that will stop Russia.

## Chicago Man Elks Exalted Ruler

Chicago (UP) — William S. Hawkins, Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, was elected grand exalted of the convention included at the 95th Grand Lodge Convention today.

Hawkins, 48, an attorney, was the youngest man ever elected to the order's highest office.

Other officers elected during the first business meeting of the convention were Edwin J. Alexander, Aberdeen, Wash., grand trustee; two persons riding horseback under way when the Alaska delegation presented the Grand Lodge with a new U. S. flag of 49 stars.

# Wall Street Chatter

New York (UP) — Stock prices are expected by Investors Research Co. to continue a strong summer rally with only minor interruptions.

It looks for a short term reaction if government efforts fail to thwart a steel strike.

Along with better breath in the depressed oil and utilities, values should hold well above recent lows, the firm says.

Standard & Poor's reports June was another month featured by good dividend news. It notes 32 dividend increases against 55 in June of 1958.

Only four reductions were voted against 58 a year ago. Omissions totaled 13 against 40 last year. There were 28 dividend resumptives.

## Centennial Wagons Leave Pocatello

Pocatello, Idaho (UP) — Rested and well fed, the Oregon Centennial wagoners left here this morning headed north through Schiller to camp five miles east of A-cian Falls.

The heavy week end traffic forced caravan officials to install blinker warning signals on the head and rear wagons. The 59'ers visited Blackfoot, Idaho, Sunday. The town, 22 miles north of here, is near the original site of Fort Hall.

The historic spot marked a stop-off for the early pioneers to the Oregon country. The site is now in the heart of the Fort Hall Indian reservation.

## Candy Barr Loses \$2,000 Mink Stole

West Hollywood, Calif. (UP) — Strip-tease dancer Candy Barr reported to police Sunday that her \$2,000 mink stole was taken from her home.

Officers said the blonde dancer filed the burglary report under her real name, Dale Phillips. The 25-year-old stripper, presently working in local nightspots, is free on \$15,000 bond pending appeal of a narcotics conviction in Dallas, Tex.

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## Barrel Believed To Be Radioactive Held in Isolation

Coos Bay (UP) — A white metal barrel thought to contain radioactive waste matter that washed up on the beach at Port Orford Saturday remained in isolation at the Coos Head Naval facility here today.

Lieutenant Commander F. L. Laws, commanding officer of the facility, said the drum, marked in red: "Danger, Radioactive Waste, AEC," was being kept under wraps as a precautionary measure until it was learned where it came from, and exactly what was inside.

Examination Planned  
Indications were that inspectors from the Atomic Energy Commission's Hanford, Wash., plant would come here to examine the barrel. The AEC in Washington, D.C., said private firms sometimes are licensed to dispose of radioactive waste but in those instances barrel's, like the AEC's, are supposed to be encased in concrete so they will be carried several hundred fathoms down.

After the barrel was sighted on the beach at Port Orford, the area was placed off limits and an armed guard set up. A team of Navy investigators from Seattle checked and said there was no radioactivity evident on the outside of the barrel or on the beach. It was taken here.

Fourth of July celebrations were delayed here until dusk.

## Linn County Cock Fight Scene Raided

Albany (UP) — About 30 Linn county sheriff's deputies and state police Saturday raided a cock fight in a barn on a farm in the Sodaville area 19 miles east of here. Twenty-three persons were charged with betting at a cock fight and more than 75 were cited for vagrancy.

The raid was led by Sheriff George Miller. Assistant Linn County District Attorney Jim Lewelling said five dead birds and a betting board were confiscated.

The cock fight was in a barn on the Vern Bridges farm. Those cited included persons from Oregon, California and Washington, Lewelling said. All were scheduled to appear in district court here Wednesday.
