The Medical Roundup

IS SEXUAL INTERCOURSE HURTFUL?
Many people want to know if indulgence in sexual intercourse is dangerous to health. I cannot remember ever having seen a patient who is

though he had been injured by excessive intercourse. Some people ask if it is bad for a heart condition. It is bad only if the man gets distressingly short of breath or develops anginal pain. If he gets pain, he may get by by first taking a tablet of nitroglycerine, which for a while will open up the coronary arteries in his heart.

Usually the only objection to daily intercourse is that the wife is unhappy about it. What is unfortunate is that the sexual athlete sometimes marries a frigid woman, and a woman who loves sex marries a man who does not care for it, and who, by the age of 40, is impotent or almost impotent. What is sad, also, is that in these cases the two people seldom will discuss their problem or say a word about it. Few will go to a

wise doctor and talk it over with him to see if anything could be done to improve matters.

The Woman Who Dribbles Urine
Many women, usually past 40, and almost always mothers of several children, are unhappy because, when they cough or sneeze, they dribble a little urine. This causes an ammonia odor, and perhaps some itching. They want to know what could be done. The best thing usually is to go to a good gynecological surgeon who will probably first push the bladder back up where it originally belongs, and then will try to bring together and sew together the bits of muscle on the front wall of the vagina which was torn and destroyed when the woman's babies were born. Then the surgeon may perform one of several operations designed to tighten up the so-called sphincter (a bit of muscle around the valve which lets urine out of the bladder). If he can tighten this up successfully, the woman will be well. The woman mustn't blame the surgeon if right off he doesn't get a good result, because experts tell me that it cannot always be done. Sometimes a second or third try will bring a tight sphincter that will close the lower end of the bladder.
