

Southern Oregon College to Host Regional Meeting

Ashland - Southern Oregon college will host the annual Pacific Northwest Conference on Higher Education July 26-28, according to Mrs. Mable Winston, SOC registrar and chairman of the conference steering committee. Meeting for the first time in Ashland, the conference will discuss "The Superior Student."

Dr. O. Meredith Wilson, president of the University of Oregon, is scheduled to give the Sunday evening keynote address. Other educators assuming leading roles in the conference are Dr. T. R. McConnell, professor of higher education at the University of California; Dr. Charles E. Rothwell, president of Mills college; Dr. John Stalnaker, president of the National Merit Scholarship Corporation; and Dr. Joseph W. Cohen, director of the Inter-University Commission on the Superior Student, University of Colorado.

All institutions of the Pacific Northwest will be represented at the conference, which has been scheduled to coincide with the Shakespearean Festival. The group will attend a dress rehearsal of "Measure for Measure" and attend the opening "Twelfth Night."

Among those hosting the conference in co-operation with the Pacific Coast Committee American Council on Education are Dr. Richard Byrns, associate professor of English; Dr. Irene Hollenbeck, associate professor of science; Dr. Bill Sampson, director of teacher education; Dr. Francis Haines, assistant professor of social science; Dr. Alvin Fellers, professor of English; and Dr. Arthur Taylor, chairman of the social science division.

Copco Methods Draw Objection

San Francisco—(UPI)—A sportsmen's group from Yreka Wednesday objected to methods of California Oregon Power Company in developing water resources.

The Klamath River Sportsmen's Association sent a letter and resolution to the State Water Rights Board, which is conducting hearings on the controversial McCloud river project.

The letter said the group did not advocate stopping hydroelectric development but was opposed to dam construction that would cause unnatural fluctuations in stream level, damage to fish life, danger to human life, and interference with agricultural and public rights.

The resolution said the power company had not built a regulatory dam proposed for 1930 and had been "entirely selfish in relation to water use on the Klamath."

Hoffa Said Taking Role in Dock Unions

Los Angeles—(UPI)—Temer President James Hoffa apparently is taking a key role in major United States dock unions, but there is no indication the Teamsters will formally merge with Harry Bridges' longshoremen's union, according to a Los Angeles publication.

The Daily Journal of Commerce speculated Wednesday about Hoffa's role in shipping contracts with longshoremen. It said in all probability Hoffa is being consulted on terms of the new contract being negotiated between the International Longshoremen's and Warehousemen's Union headed by Bridges and the Pacific Maritime Association which represents West Coast ship operators.

Fire Chiefs Slate Spokane Meeting

Spokane—(UPI)—About 700 delegates from western states are expected here next week for the annual conference of the Pacific Coast Intermountain Association of Fire Chiefs.

Fire Chief W. A. Dunham here said technical sessions and displays of firefighting equipment will highlight the four-day 64th annual meeting.

Gov. Albert D. Rosellini is scheduled to be an honor guest. Presiding at the sessions will be association President Ivan L. Peterson, McMinnville, Ore.

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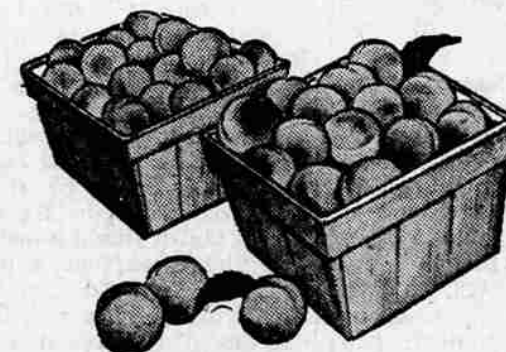
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
