

Negro Guilty of Looking at Legs

Richmond, Va.—(UPI)—A Negro was convicted Wednesday of being a person of ill fame for "conspicuously" looking at the legs of women drivers.

Judge W. Moscoe Huntley ordered George Hunt, 26, to post a \$300 good behavior bond after upholding Hunt's earlier conviction in police court.

Hunt was arrested when women drivers complained they had seen Hunt and another Negro staring down at them from a high point as they drove into a parking garage here.

Patrolman W. R. Blaylock testified that Hunt and James Banks were watching the women on a hot day last month. Many had raised their skirts while driving to take advantage of the breeze.

Charges against Banks have not been pressed, since he is ill and quarantined at home.

Nation's Powerful Private Eye Often Stymied by State Borders

Washington (UPI)—The FBI is the nation's most powerful private eye. It moves in wherever a Federal crime is committed.

But when it comes to murder, lynchings and hate bombings, the G-men are often stymied by a state line.

The limited jurisdiction of J. Edgar Hoover's bureau when it comes to crimes of violence was vividly illustrated to the nation in the FBI's recent withdrawal from the Mack Charles Parker lynching case.

On orders of Attorney General William P. Rogers, agents began swarming all over Poplarville, Miss., hours after the 23-year-old Negro victim was abducted from jail while awaiting trial on a rape charge.

The FBI cracked the case, identified the suspects and then bowed out after turning the facts over to state authorities for prosecution.

'Local' Affair

It had no alternative. The

Justice Department decided the lynching was a "local" affair. It found Parker had not been transported across state lines, which would have been a violation of the Linbergh Kidnap Act and a basis for Federal prosecution. Nor had any other Federal offense been committed.

The kidnap-murder of one-month-old Peter Weinberger in New York in 1958 was the same story. The FBI solved the case, but proved that Angelo La Marca had not violated the Federal Kidnap Statute because he did not carry the infant out of the state of New York.

La Marca was convicted in a state court and executed for the crime.

Only Federal Offenses

The FBI is the Justice Department's detective agency. It looks into Federal offenses, and Federal offenses alone. The bureau may not investigate violations of state or local laws—even when requested to do so by local authorities or groups of private citizens.

The FBI has authority to move in on bank robberies, fraud against the government, crimes on India and government reservations, theft, embezzlement or destruction of government property and interstate transportation of stolen vehicles or aircraft.

It also has a reputation for cloak and dagger operations against spies and subversives. And it draws up dossiers on government appointees and employees to halt any Communist baring from within.

In short, the FBI is strictly a fact-gathering and fact-reporting agency. It passes its findings on to other Federal agencies to make decisions for prosecution.

But the FBI does not evaluate these facts, draw conclusions as to guilt or innocence, express opinions, issue "clearances" or even make recommendations for action.

Famous for List

The FBI also is famous for

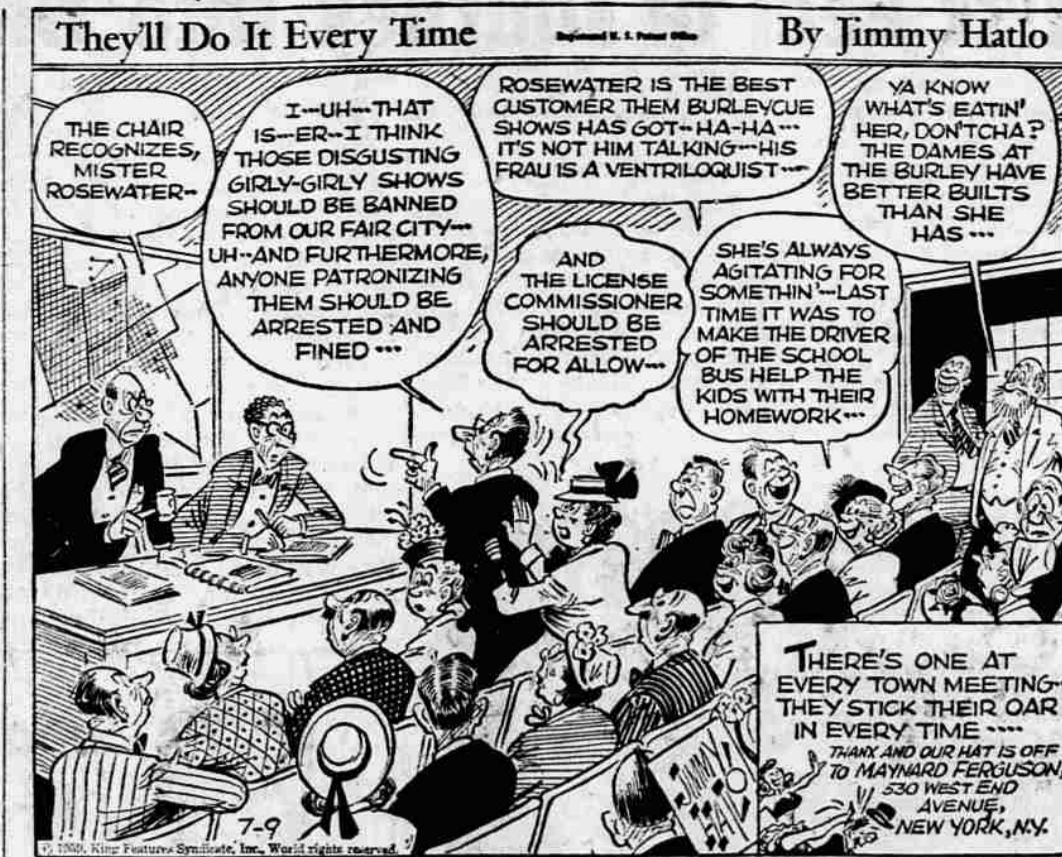
its "most wanted" fugitive list. But even here, when fugitives who have crossed state lines are located, they are turned over to the custody of local authorities.

The lines are not so tightly drawn, however, that the FBI cannot help local and state police in a specific way.

Through its cooperative services, the FBI identifies fingerprints sent in by policemen working on murders or accident cases. It trains police in the latest whodunit techniques and it swaps information of mutual interest.

During its investigations, the FBI often turns up information regarding violations of state and local laws. The FBI promptly tips authorities concerned.

When the FBI makes out a Federal case, the Justice Department takes over and prosecutes. During the 1958 fiscal year 11,457 convictions—a 10-year high—were recorded in cases investigated by the FBI.
