Harriman Hopes For Summit Talk In United States

New York — (UPI) — Averill Harriman said today he hopes a summit conference will be held in the United States so that Russian Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev can see this country for himself.

Harriman arrived home early today from a Russian visit and an interview with a tough-talking Khrushchev. He said he would go to Washington Friday to report on the meeting to Secretary of State Christian A. Herter and Vice President Richard M. Nixon.

No Accurate Report

Harriman said he thought that "no one makes an accurate report to Khrushchev" on the United States and in any case, "you cannot learn about the United States through someone else's eyes."

He told newsmen who met him at Idlewild Airport that he believes a summit conference is necessary because Khrushchev "is calling the signals for foreign policy."

"Whenever there are loaded weapons there are dangers," Harriman said. "The situation is dangerous, and therefore I think Khrushchev should be informed face to face of our position."

Glad for Nixon Trip

Harriman said he was glad Nixon is going to Moscow and "I hope he will have some influence."

The former New York governor and wartime ambassador to Russia said in London Wednesday night that he was of the opinion that Khrushchev "wants to come to the United States and come face to face with the Western leaders."

"There is no better place than New York to hold any meeting," he said.

53 Powder Puff Derby Airplanes Complete Race

Spokane, Wash. — (UPI) — Pilots and co-pilots of 53 Powder Puff Derby airplanes today were to learn which of them would split a \$2500 purse and become the top women pilots of the year.

Twenty-seven entries in the cross-continent air race to Felt's Field here crossed the finish line before the 12:00 a.m. (p.s.t.) deadline Wednesday, four days after takeoff from Lawrence, Mass., Municipal Airport.

Twenty-three planes landed Tuesday.

Indians First

The first plane to arrive Sunday morning was piloted by Mrs. Margaret Ringenberg, Fort Wayne, Ind., and co-piloted by Lois Laymon, also of Fort Wayne.

Twenty-four hours after Mrs. Ringenberg's arrival, three others set down here.

A reported eight planes were disqualified from the race when they were forced to remain overnight at non-designated airports because of bad weather, which plagued all the contestants to greater or lesser degrees.

Separate Leg Races

Race officials said, however, at least four of the teams in the 13th annual all-woman race may be eligible for competition in the separate leg races.

The Federal Aviation Agency here said 58 powder puff planes were counted at Felt's Field, some of them flown by disqualified pilots who will attend a one-day convention of the International Ninety Nines Association, sponsors of the annual race.

Last year's champion, Frances Bera, Long Beach, Calif., had electrical trouble with her plane in Montana Tuesday, but arrived here shortly after 9 a.m. Wednesday.

Pearl Harbor War Memorial Planned

Phoenix — (UPI) — The 50 states of the union were connected Wednesday in a conference telephone call made to discuss a fund-raising drive for building a war memorial in Pearl Harbor.

Gov. Paul Fannin spoke from his office in the Arizona capitol to the 49 other governors or their representatives about plans to raise \$122,000 for the construction of a memorial to the 1,102 sailors and Marines who went down with the battleship Arizona in Pearl Harbor, Dec. 7, 1941.

Fannin said the motion picture "John Paul Jones" was scheduled to be shown in various state capitols from Aug. 4 to Aug. 11 with proceeds to go to the war memorial.
