Western Open Golf Paced by Campbell

Pittsburgh—(UPI)—Joe Campbell, pacing a phalanx of par-busting on the challenging Pittsburgh Field club course, said today "it's still anybody's race" as he took a one-stroke lead into the second round of the Western Open.

The modest crew-cut swinger from Knoxville, Tenn., shrugged off comment about his five-under-par 65 Thursday in the opening round of the \$25,000 event. His total was one stroke less than the former course record set in 1953 by Chick Harbert in a National Open qualifying round.

Campbell, former Big Ten golfing champion who turned pro only 15 months ago, blistered a 32 on the outgoing round and returned in 33. He reeled off seven birdies.

13 Break Par
"When I look around and see Doug Ford with a 66 pressing me, then I know it's still anybody's race," Campbell said.

Ford, 36-year-old Canadian Open champion from Paradise, Fla., shot a six-over par 36 on the front nine but atoned with a blistering 30

on the return for his 66. All told, 13 competitors broke par. Tied for third place with 67's were Huston Paddy La Clair, Birmingham, Ala.; Mike Souchak, Grossinger, N.Y.; Arnold Palmer, Ligonier, Pa., and Burt Weaver, Beaumont, Tex.

Bunched in the 68 circle were Bob Duden, Portland, Ore.; J. C. Gossie, Knoxville, Tenn., and Fred Hawkins, El Paso, Tex. Rounding out the sub-par category were Joe Zakarian, Detroit; Julius Boros, Mid-Plains, N.C.; Bill Golins, Baltimore, and George Bayer, Lemont, Ill. — all with 69s.

AAU Swim Test Begins

Los Altos, Calif.—(UPI)—The big splash which might cause choppy water as far off as Japan was launched today when some 300 of America's finest swimmers and divers took to the pool in opening competition of the Men's National AAU Outdoor championships.

Amid predictions of victory over the Nipponese when a select U. S. swim team goes to Tokyo later this month, the battle for berths started today in the three-meter spring board diving, 100 meter free-style, 400 medley individual medley and 1,500 meter free style.

Coach Willis Casey of North Carolina State, who has tutored swimmers for 18 years after an attack of tuberculosis ruined his own career as a merman, flatly predicted Thursday that the squad which he is to head will defeat the Japanese.

Casey's crew has a date in Tokyo with Japan's best July 20-22 followed by other meets in the Far East.

Leesburg, Ind.—(UPI)—Mickey Wright carded a brilliant 68, two under men's par, Thursday to set a Tippecanoe Lake Country club course record for women and capture the \$2,600 Tippecanoe Lake women's golf tourney.

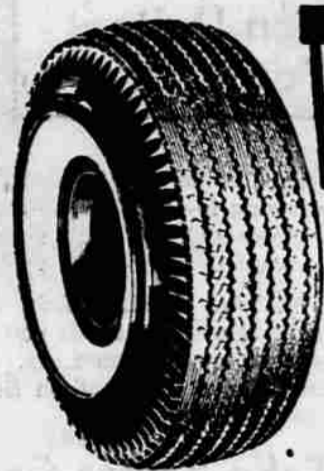
