Oregon Caves 'Golden' Today

Oregon Caves National monument is celebrating its golden anniversary today, according to Tom Williams, superintendent of Crater Lake National Park and the monument.

President William H. Taft, on July 12, 1909, proclaimed the Oregon Caves and 450 acres of the surrounding forest as a national monument. By this action, President Taft ensured that the scientific and educational values of the "Marble Halls of Oregon" would be preserved for the benefit and enjoyment of the American people.

The verdant forest in the monument area is also being preserved. This small area in the Siskiyou mountains is of special interest for its plant associations, being a meeting place where northern plants reach the southern extremity of their range and are met by plants extending their range from the south. Labeled nature trails provide visitors the opportunity to know the flowers by name.

Oregon Caves National monument is open throughout the year. Guided trips through the cave are scheduled nine times daily during the summer season.
