

Soviets Limit Nixon's Flights During His Visit

Washington—UPI—Russia has refused to let Vice President Richard M. Nixon fly home from his Soviet visit by way of Siberia and Alaska, the state department said yesterday.

The department said the Soviets also would not permit Nixon to use his huge commercial jetliner to fly to certain Russian cities outside Moscow. He will have to use Russian planes.


