**Retired Judge Dies at Portland**

Portland—Retired judge of the United States Customs Court, Walter H. Evans Sr., died Monday at the Portland Heart hospital where he had lived for the past six years.

Evans served on the Federal Court in New York and took up residence in the hospital following surgery in 1953. He had been previously prominent in civic affairs in Portland.

Evans was appointed to the nine-member Customs Court in 1931 by President Herbert Hoover. He also held positions as assistant U. S. attorney, Multnomah county district attorney and Multnomah County Circuit Judge.

**DERMABRASION OF THE FACE**

Many people whose face is badly pitted from an old acne wonder if they should have a "dermabrasion" done. In this operation after the skin is anesthetized, a dermatologist or a plastic surgeon will try to rub the skin smooth with a special instrument. After some days, a scab comes off, and after this, the face is likely to be much smoother. I know a number better. When I see the man early in his illness, I ask an orthopedist to put him quickly into a strong brace or body-cast so that perhaps his spine won't collapse enough to give him a lot of pain. When the spine collapses, naturally, some of the nerves that come out through it on each side are pinched, and this can cause pain in the chest or in the abdominal wall. Obviously, the man needs more calcium in his bones, but giving him calcium rarely does any good. It's like the old story of taking a horse to water when he won't drink. I doubt if the problem has yet been solved to anyone's satisfaction.

**Senate GOP Split**

**On Choice of Bohlen**

Washington —(UPI)— Senate Republicans were split sharply Monday over whether Charles E. Bohlen should be given a top job in the State Department as special consultant on Russian affairs.

Chairman Styles Bridges (N.H.) of the Senate GOP Police Committee was reported to be leading the fight against Bohlen, former ambassador to Russia and now ambassador to the Philippines. Sen. Milton R. Young (R-N.D.) and others also opposed the proposed move.

But Sen. Barry Goldwater (R-Ariz.) said he favored giving Bohlen the position. Goldwater, who voted against Bohlen's appointment as ambassador to Russia in 1953, said he believed the envoy did a good job in Moscow.
