Swimming Classes Set at Hawthorne

Committee OK's Equal Time Ruling

Washington - UPI - The Senate Commerce Committee today unanimously approved a bill to except radio and TV news programs from the equal-time requirements of the Federal Communications law. Chairman Warren G. Magnuson (D-Wash.) announced the committee's action.

The present law provides that broadcasters must give equal time to all candidates for office. The committee bill would except "appearances by a legally qualified candidate on a newscast, news interview, news documentary, on the spot coverage of news events or panel discussion."

Steels, Electronics Lead Stocks Higher

New York - UPI - Steels and electronics led stocks higher today.

The market generally ignored the nationwide steel strike.

Steels were upside leaders most of the session. Gains running to around a point or more appeared in Jones & Laughlin, Lukens, National Steel, U. S. Steel, Wheeling Steel, and Youngstown.

Texas Instruments rose around 8 points at its high in the electronics, where Zenith was up more than 3. American Shipbuilding jumped around 4 to its high in the group and Schering was up more than 2 in the drugs.

International Salt spurred more than 8 points in the chemicals, where gains running to a point predominated. Ralls, which will be one of the first industries to feel the steel strike, were lower on balance.
