

Nation's Highest Highway In Northern Colorado Open for Summer Use

OVERCOME WORKERS

Canton, Ga. — (UPI) — Ammonia fumes spewed from a broken refrigeration pipe at a poultry processing plant Tuesday, overcoming 18 workers, most of them women. The fumes also contaminated waste disposal which in turn killed hundreds of fish in a small stream near the plant. Three of the women overcome had to be revived by oxygen.

Estes Park, Colo. (UPI) — The nation's highest continuous highway — cloud-scraping Trail Ridge Road in northern Colorado — is open for the summer, offering tourists a first-hand view of some of the most spectacular mountain

country in the world. The 42-mile road cuts a winding swath over the Continental Divide through Rocky Mountain National Park and connects two of Colorado's top resort areas — Estes Park and Grand Lake.

12,183 Feet High
The highest point on Trail Ridge is 12,183 feet above sea level and the road runs more than 11 miles at altitudes in excess of 11,000 feet.

Built by the U.S. government at a cost of \$2,750,000, the two lane highway is maintained jointly by the U.S. Bureau of Public Roads and the state of Colorado. Construction was started in 1926 and finally completed in 1950.

Official opening of Trail Ridge on Memorial Day signalled the start of Colorado's tourist season. Crews mowing rotary mowers usually begin clearing the highway of heavy winter snows about May 1, but drifts as high as 30 feet have frequently delayed the scheduled May 30 opening.

Colorful ribbon-cutting ceremonies — pegged to a "hands across the mountains" theme — are held every year as hundreds of motorists line up to make the mountain drive.

Often Closed
Trail Ridge usually remains open until about Oct. 1. But weather often steps in to close it down for short periods during the summer.

In June, 1954, 14 cars and 36 persons were marooned for 12 hours when a sudden storm piled three-foot snow drifts at the 12,000-foot level. Once, the road was closed by a July hail storm.

Snow can be found along Trail Ridge above timberline throughout the summer, giving tourists a chance to tell the folks back home about making snowballs in the middle of July.

Two words of caution if you're planning to travel on Trail Ridge Road: Make sure the carburetor on your car has been adjusted for high-

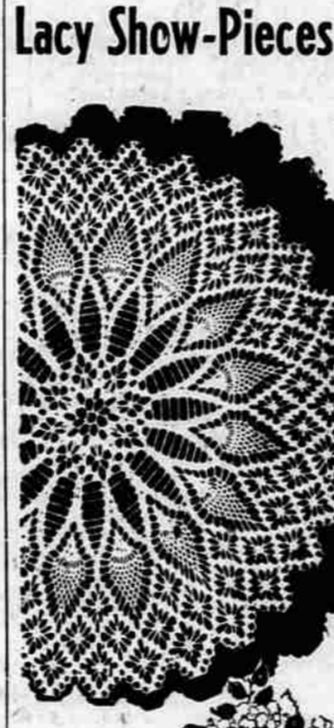
