

Giants, Phillies Both Win Games; Reds Snap Streak

The San Francisco Giants' late-inning lightning struck again Saturday and lifted Bill Rigney's National league leaders to a 4-3 victory over the Pittsburgh Pirates.

Willie Mays, who previously had connected for two doubles, followed an eighth-inning single by Jim Davenport with his 16th home run of the year to lead the Pirates their third straight defeat. Harvey Haddix suffered his fourth setback of the year as a result of the blow.

The Pirates threatened in the ninth when Bill Mazeroski led off with a single and moved to second on a sacrifice but Mike McCormick struck out pinch-hitter Roman Mejias and retired pinch-hitter Ted Kluszewski on a pop. Rookie Eddie Fisher received credit for his second win with McCormick's aid.

The Pirates scored all their runs in the first inning when Dick Stuart hit his 18th homer with Roberto Clemente and Dick Groat on base.

Don Cardwell's four-hitter and a two-run homer by Ed Bouchee carried the Philadelphia Phillies to a 5-2 decision over the Los Angeles Dodgers. Cardwell walked three and struck out three. One of the four hits he yielded was a first-inning homer by Wally Moon. The loss plunged the Dodgers three full games behind the first-place Giants.

Ken Boyer singled home Joe Estey, 29-year-old veteran golfer won the City of Portland Golf Championships at Eastmoreland here Saturday with a 10 and 9 victory over Dick Hogan, 22.

Mike Hood of Medford took four firsts in the 15-16 age group yesterday in the All-Comers AAU track and field meet at Medford High school, setting three records and tying one.

Phil Humphreys of Medford was a double winner in the same division and Dan Lumley of Phoenix took dual honors in the sprints.

Hood set records in the 120 yard low hurdles (13.9), the high jump (5'7") and the broad jump (21'6") and tied the record in the 70 yard high hurdles (.09.2).

Humphreys set a new record in the 440 with the good time of 56 seconds flat and won the pole vault with a leap of 7'6".

Lumley tied the record in the 75-yard dash with a time of .07.9 and took the 225 in .23.4.
