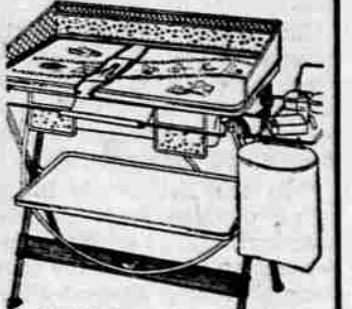
Members are to meet at the southeast corner of the city park on Holly street. Each attending is to bring a covered dish and table service.
