The Family Council

Editor's note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual report. The Family Council does not give advice; it merely reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and counselors.

Roberta D.—My sister-in-law won't respect my standards. **Leonard B.**—She shouldn't try to change her.

Roberta D.—My younger brother and his bride recently came to stay with me in my home until they find a place of their own and get settled in our community. My sister-in-law is a charming girl and I am very fond of her, but I'm afraid we haven't gotten along as well as I would like. For one thing, she is very set in her ways. She is 19 and I am 10 years older so I think I can teach her a few things, but at one word from me she does exactly as she pleases.

I feel that when she has her own home she can do as she likes, but I expect her to respect my standards while she is with me. For example, she has a habit of running out of the house in the morning in her robe and slippers to buy a newspaper. This is embarrassing to me and I told her so. She has been in a huff ever since and my brother is angry with me.

Leonard B.—My wife and I appreciate Roberta's hospital-

ity very much, but I don't think that she should try to change Sheila. It is true that Sheila is stubborn and doesn't take criticism readily, but it shouldn't concern Roberta. The neighbors aren't going to think any worse of her if her sister-in-law runs outside in a robe and slippers. Sheila comes from a small town where the standards are very different from what they are here. Roberta should recognize that not everyone can be the same. She has made Sheila very unhappy about something that isn't important.

Sheila really likes Roberta very much, but she just isn't the kind to be bossed. It is hard starting our married life in a place that isn't our own. I have wanted to get just a room elsewhere, but Roberta won't hear of it.

The Council: While much of what Leonard says is true, we can't see where Roberta has done wrong by telling her sister-in-law that she is violating standards that are important to her.

It is true that the neighbors probably won't think any worse of Roberta if her sister-in-law goes out of the house in a robe, but it is natural for Roberta to want others to think highly of her family. Roberta's pride in her family should be considered. She holds a certain position in the community and wants her brother and sister-in-law to share it.

Roberta shows genuine liking for Sheila when she expresses concern about her appearance and Sheila is rather childish to get into a "huff" about constructive criticism. It is her obligation as a guest to uphold the standards of the family whose hospitality she is enjoying.

Outside of this issue, we think Roberta should curb her desire to teach or criticize. All learning implies a willing or eager pupil. It is useless to try to foist teachings on a reluctant pupil. Sheila will undoubtedly have to learn many things the hard way, but it would be foolish for Roberta to impair the future relations in an effort to make things easier for Sheila. Oral auction bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, his authorized representative at the office of the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Jackson County, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 p.m., August 21, 1959, for all merchantable timber marked or designated for cutting on an area embracing 150 acres, more or less, within sections 3, 9, and 10 of T. 40 S., R. 1 E., W.M. surveyed, in the Rogue River National Forest, Jackson County, Oregon. The estimated volumes are 400 M board feet of Douglas-fir; 340 M board feet of Ponderosa pine; 120 M board feet of Sugar pine; 140 M board feet of White fir and other species. The minimum acceptable bid per M board feet is as follows: Douglas-fir \$23.50, Ponderosa pine \$27.50, Sugar pine \$39.45, White fir & other species, \$8.40.
