The only immediate answer I can see to the Communist problem in America is education of individual Americans to the nature and danger of Communism. This—plus constant publicity on Communist operations—can at least serve to make Americans more alert than they are now. Communism as a system hasn't a chance when pitted against our form of government in an open battle of ideologies. But forced underground, it is eating away at the foundations of our liberty.

Another question I'm asked repeatedly is: "Would you do it all over again?"

Certainly I would! I feel that I was able to help our Government, and this was well worth the personal sacrifice of myself and my family. I'm certainly not the first American to do this, nor will I be the last. Throughout our history, millions of Americans have risked or given their lives to preserve individual freedom throughout the world.

I'm grateful to our Government for the chance to contribute to this cause. I only hope the things I discovered will serve as a warning to all Americans—and that my family and I can now enjoy the peace and contentment we've missed for the past 16 years.
