Wagons Depart For Caldwell

Boise — (UP) — The On-to-Oregon wagon train left here today for a trip to Caldwell about 20 miles away. The train camped here over the week end.

Hundred of Boiseans went out to the train's campground about 10 miles from the city Sunday, creating a traffic jam and forcing state police and sheriff's officers to send extra cars to direct congested traffic.

The wagon train, which is making the 2,020-mile trip during the Oregon Centennial year, will end its journey at Independence, Ore., after stops at cities along the Oregon trail.

The wagon train is due in its home state at Nyssa about noon Tuesday. It will meet there by state officials, including Secretary of State Howell Appling and Centennial Commission Chairman Anthony Brandthaler.

It left Independence, Mo., April 19. A big celebration is scheduled Aug. 15 in Independence, Ore., the end of the trail.

The Medical Roundup

A New Technique for Recognizing Early Cancer

At the recent Boston meeting of the pathologists and bacteriologists a decision was made to substitute for the standard Papanicolaou test a new method in which the smears are stained with a fluorescent stain. With this new stain, cancers can be found which would have been missed with the ordinary technic.

Surgeon-General Leroy E. Burney warned the other day that smallpox vaccination is still very necessary, and particularly so for those planning to travel abroad. Last December a German physician came back to the U.S. from India, carrying smallpox in his body, and before the epidemic that his illness had started could be stopped, there were 18 cases with two deaths. If the Public Health authorities had not jumped in and worked rapidly, vaccinating all possible contacts, the results could have been tragic.

A while ago we had another similar scare in this country, when a man with smallpox flew in from a country south of our border, where smallpox prevention is not so rigid as it is in this country.

What is sad is that hundreds of thousands, and perhaps millions, of people in this country, never having seen the wild-fire spread and the horrors of a smallpox epidemic, labor under the delusion that vaccination against smallpox is no longer necessary. Some even fight actively against the measure, and hire lawyers to keep their children from being protected. If they only knew something about medical history, they would never do so foolish a thing.

Back in 1903, when I first went to Mexico, I think every third Mexican I saw was badly pock-marked, and many of the otherwise beautiful women were terribly unhappy because of the disfigurement of their face. There were many blind beggars who had lost their sight in an attack of smallpox.

Vaccine Against Measles

At a recent meeting of the Society for Pediatric Research, Dr. Samuel L. Katz, and Dr. John F. Enders reported that they have what is called a live attenuated measles vaccine. This would be a wonderful boon for humanity because measles is not always a safe disease. Every so often it leaves a child mentally crippled for life. Physicians will be watching with great interest the further progress of this research—also the progress of another similar research going on in Southern California—also with hopeful results.

Vandals Destroy Paintings, Mark Walls of Museum

Columbus, Ga. — (UP) — Police today sought "thrill-seeking" vandals who painted crude Nazi swastikas on the walls of an art museum here and burned 165 valuable paintings, exhibits and art objects.

The vandals stripped the paintings from the walls of three second-floor exhibit rooms of the Columbus Museum of Arts and Crafts late Saturday night, piled them in the middle of the floor and set them ablaze.

The fire was fed with articles from a collection of antique clothing, dresses and suits from the 1890s.

Then, the unknown intruders scratched six or seven swastikas on the cloth-covered walls of the gallery with ink or charcoal.

Police said they believed the vandals were the same ones who painted Nazi swastikas at the rear entrances of two Jewish houses of worship last Wednesday and Friday.

Despite the use of the swastikas as their trademark, the police Capt. J. T. Spence said he did not think the destruction was the work of an organized gang.

"It looks just like plain vandalism," he said. "The clues are few, but there is no evidence of any organized gang."

The guest book at the museum showed one recent visitor had signed his name "Adolph Hitler." Swastikas and "heil Hitler" were painted with red and yellow paint on the two synagogues.
