A brush fire broke out about 11:30 a.m. yesterday on Bear creek just north of Head rd. It was extinguished and then broke out again at 3:30 p.m. and was put out once more. About two acres of grass and brush were burned but two tankers, a pumper and 12 men were called out before the blaze was finally killed.

Leaders included some issues hardest hit in the recent sell-off. Individual gains ran past 5 points at the highs in some issues.

Litton, Motorola, Ampex and Zenith were strong in the electronics. DuPont led the chemicals higher and most of the steels were up 1 to 2 points. Autos chalked up gains running past a point as did some of the drugs.
