Kidney Stones

Many people ask what to do about repeated attacks of kidney stones. The important thing always is to have an expert study the blood chemistry to see if there are any signs indicating the disease of the parathyroid glands. These are little bean-like glands situated back of the thyroid gland in the neck. They have to do with the handling of calcium (lime) in our bodies.

With certain diseases of these glands calcium accumulates first in the blood and then perhaps in the urine. Some people, perhaps with a tendency to gout, have stones that are made up largely of uric acid. Some people who have only very small kidney stones suffer from time to time with terrible pain when a bit of gravel, as it is called, goes down the ureter (the tube which runs from the kidney to the bladder).

Some persons with a kidney stone so large that it can't go down the ureter may be better off for having it removed surgically. A few persons have a stone which completely fills one of their kidneys. It is called a staghorn stone, because of its shape. Because it practically always destroys the kidney function, and because this function would not

Strangle Case Goes To Jury

San Diego—UPI—The first degree murder case of an Illinois couple accused of killing two small boys because they were "a bother" goes to a jury of six men and six women today.

Mrs. Wanda Brogdon, 33, mother of the slain boys, and her lover, Kenneth Merriam, 36, face mandatory sentences of death in the gas chamber or life imprisonment if convicted.

"We have overwhelmingly proved first degree murder," Deputy District Attorney Mac Lovett told the jury in closing arguments Wednesday. "If you compromise you will be compromising one of the most vicious murders in the country."

Mrs. Brogdon's attorney appealed for leniency for his client, claiming she was unaware Merriam intended to strangle her sons, Virgil Jr., 5, and David, 3, last May 2. Merriam's attorney made the same appeal, but charged that Merriam was merely "a tool in the hands of his mistress, Mrs. Brogdon."
