**The Family Council**

Editor's note: The Family Council consists of a judge, a psychiatrist, three clergymen, a newspaper editor, a women's editor and two writers. Each article is a summary of an actual report. The Family Council does not give advice; it merely reports on problems that have been dealt with by responsible agencies and consumers.

Laura S. — Mother resents our attentions.  
Mrs. M. L. — I don't want sympathy from anyone.

Laura S. — I am having a hard time understanding my mother's behavior.  
She was recently widowed after a happy marriage of 30 years. My sister and I wanted her to come to stay with one of us, but she refused. I can understand her wanting to be independent, but I can't understand her avoiding us and other close relatives and friends.

We aren't trying to force my mother to be gay and social. We just want to be near her — at least as much as we were in the past. She seems to resent any ordinary attentions we give her.

Mrs. M. L. — One thing I don't want is people feeling sorry for me. I am not afraid of being alone. I have a part-time job and am looking for new interests. I can get along by myself.

I want to make a whole new circle of friends — widows like myself or other single women. I don't want people inviting me just to be kind. I don't want any sympathy from even my own daughters. When they call me several times a day to find out how I am, it just annoys me. When I visit them they make a production about driving me home. My husband and I always took the bus.

The Council: Mrs. M. L. appears to be overstraining in her attempt to be courageous. Her fixed idea that everyone is acting purely out of sympathy for her is a little off the beam and is probably rooted in her own fear that she will be left alone and forgotten. Her family and friends are undoubtedly sympathetic, but it is more than likely that they are also fond of her company and want it just as much now that she is a widow as when she had her husband.

Widowhood represents a new phase of life to any individual, but that doesn't mean that there should be no carry-over from the past. It is possible to find new interests and friends gradually as one changes and as circumstances allow. The only kind of situation in life that calls for a complete break with the past is one in which an individual has been involved in

an unhealthy, immoral setup. Mrs. M. L. seems to feel that her position as a widow makes a social outcast of her. She wants to associate only with others in this outcast group, fearing to expose herself in the ordinary social stream.

We don't think the daughters should force too many attentions on their mother while she is not in the mood to accept them in the right spirit. But we think that Mrs. M. L. should also avoid forcing herself to do things that are beyond her emotional reach at the moment. If she consults her innermost feelings she will find she wants warm contact with her old friends and close relatives. This contact will strengthen her for the next steps — new friends and interests and a more independent life.

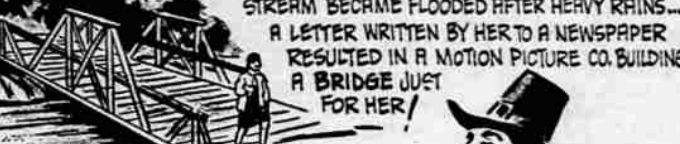

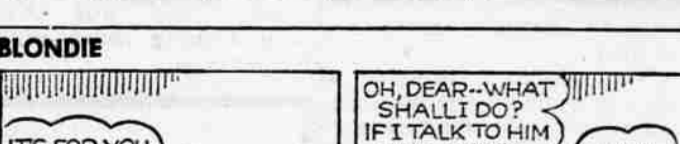
