

Peery Tops RVL Hitting Statistics

Riddle's Mickey Coen has stretched his strikeout list to 71 in the Rogue Valley Baseball league. With five league games yet to be played, Coen's mark is nine ahead of the league record of 62, set by Jack Turk last year for Butte Falls.

Coen's record of 7 wins and 10 losses puts him on top of the pitching parade but following closely is Ashland's D'Olive with a five and one record, and 53 strikeouts.

Ashland and Riddle are currently 1-2 in the league standings for the second half of the season, but a meeting of the two clubs today will put one of them out ahead.

Batters
The top position in the league batting averages has been changing hands like a mustard jar at a picnic. Heading the list this week is Ron Peery of Medford, with a .517, up from fifth position last week.

Based on a minimum of 14 times at bat, Layton Dietz is second with an even .500, a notch below his top spot last week.

Third is Ray Munyon of Glendale with a .458 and Ashland's King is fourth with a .438.

Team Average High
Medford's team batting average still leads the pack, with a .296 mark. Following are Ashland, .288, Riddle, .271, Glendale, .264, Camp White, .242, Grants Pass, .209, and Butte Falls, .164.

Spikemen Smash Records In All-Comers Track Meet Here

Fifteen records were either tied or broken yesterday in the junior divisions of the All-Comers championship track and field meet at Medford high school. The meet marked the completion of Medford's first summer season of weekly track meets held under AAU auspices. Co-directors of the summer program were Don Spinas and Dean Benson.

Open and high school events were scheduled to begin at 5 p.m. yesterday.

Boys 15-16 Age Group
Mike Hood and Phil Humphreys, Medford's amazing decathlon men, junior style, swept to seven firsts; three seconds, a third and a fourth place between them in the boys 15-16 age group.

Hood took firsts in the high and low hurdles, the high jump and the broad jump. He holds the summer record in all four of the events.

Humphreys took firsts in the 75 yard dash, the 220 yard dash and the 440 yard run.

His 440 time was good enough for a new record, at 54.5 seconds, and his time in the short sprint tied the season record set by Dan Lumley of Phoenix.

Lumley was second in both sprints yesterday and also took a fourth in the broad jump.

George Clearwater was third in both sprints, behind Lumley, and took a first place in the shot put and thirds in the high jump and javelin.

Boys 13-14 Age Group
Honors were split among Vern Swanson of Central Point and Pat Pepper of Central Point in the boys 13-14 age group, for first-place positions. Some other fine competitors divided up the ribbons for second and third place positions.

Swanson took firsts in the 75, the 220, the 440 and the high hurdles. He set a new record of 55.8 seconds in the quarter-mile.

Pepper threw his way to first places in the shot, jave-

lin and discus, setting a new record in the spear event. Ron Calkins of Medford jumped 5'2" to establish a new mark in the high jump.

Boys 11-12
Dennis Ryerson of Central Point took five firsts in the boys 11-12 age group, in the 75, the 220, the 440, the broad jump and the shot put. His 9.1 second time in the 75 was fast enough for a new mark.

Other ribbon winners in this age group were Jim Brennan, Jack Mullen, Larry Humphreys and Dennis Bolz.

Steve Ryerson of Central Point took three firsts in the boys 9-10 group, in the 75, the 220, and the shot put.

In the girls 13-14 group it was Karen Schroeder, Sharon Beare and Bonnie Polk splitting up the first-place ribbons. Karen took three firsts, Sharon got two and Bonnie collected one.

Sally Eaton was the sole winner in the girls 11-12 group as she swept to six blue ribbons and established a new record in the shot put.

11 Pros Nip Course Par

Chicago — (UP) — Women golf pros in the Mount Prospect Country Club Women's Open took the course records apart Saturday with 11 of the 36 pros equaling or breaking par, and Mickey Wright took a one-stroke lead with the second-best round of the day.

Miss Wright, winner of the last two ladies' PGA tournaments, knocked four strokes off par with a 70 for a 145 total for 36 holes. But the Bonita, Calif., golfer was only one stroke ahead of the first-round leader, Louise Suggs, Sea Island, Ga., and Betsy Rawls, the women's leading money winner from Spartanburg, S. C.

Miss Suggs, the only player to break par on the first round, fired her second consecutive 73 Saturday and Miss Rawls vaulted into contention with a course record 69. Miss Rawls had five birdies, and no bogeys on her tour, and played in par to 17 greens. Her longest putt was a mere 10 feet.
