Lewis pleaded not guilty before Judge Ray D. Shoemaker who set trial for July 29 at 10 a.m., and was released on \$50 bail.



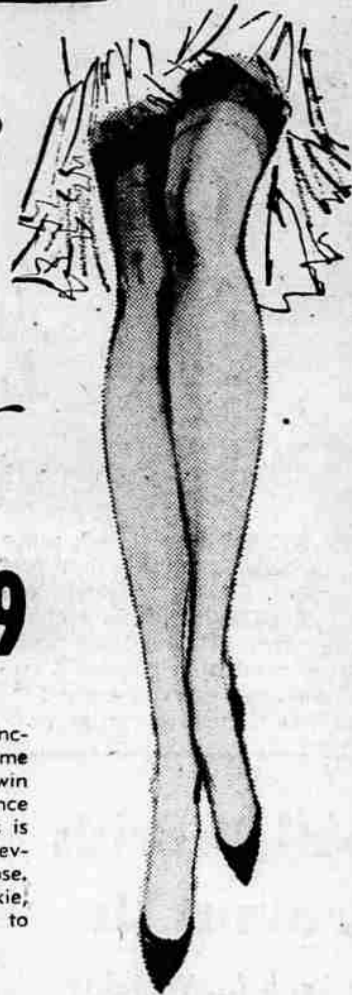
