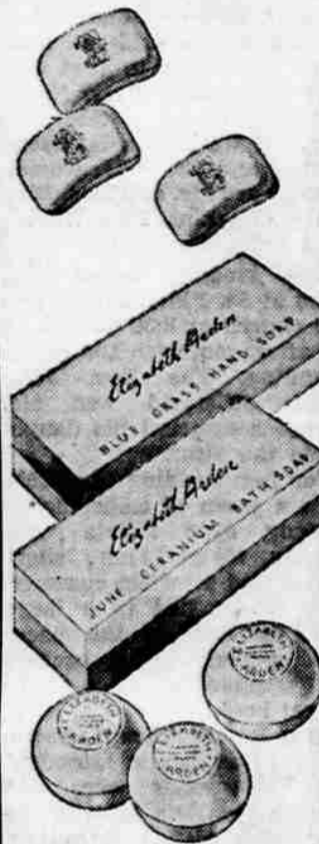
The family drove East via Reno and Salt Lake City where they visited the Mormon Temple. They returned by driving through Wyoming and Idaho.
