

### Nixon's Conduct Draws Praise from GOP Leaders Here

Washington—(UPI)—Vice President Richard M. Nixon's conduct in Moscow drew praise today from Republican leaders but a Democratic presidential aspirant questioned the wisdom of his public debates with Soviet Premier Nikita S. Khrushchev.

Senate GOP leader Everett M. Dirksen (Ill.) said Nixon's visit to the Soviet capital had boosted his political stock and accomplished "significant good" for U. S. foreign policy.

Rep. Richard M. Simpson (Pa.), chairman of the Republican Congressional Campaign committee, hailed Nixon's handling of Khrushchev. He said Nixon is becoming the free world's "secret weapon" in the cold war.

But Sen. Hubert H. Humphrey (D-Minn.) expressed doubt that Nixon should have engaged in public debates with Khrushchev as they did Friday at the opening of the U. S. exhibit.

Humphrey, who had an eight-hour interview with the Soviet premier earlier this year, told newsmen "it is difficult to win in any rough and tumble with Khrushchev."

**Expresses Hope**  
He expressed hope that Nixon would be able to advance the cause of the free world more effectively in his private talks with Khrushchev. On the whole, however, he said, the idea of the Nixon trip was "very constructive."

Both Dirksen and Humphrey, in separate interviews with United Press International, praised Nixon's decision to visit Poland on his way home from the Soviet Union.

Dirksen said he was "delighted" with the results of the trip so far. He said he thought Nixon did "extremely well" in his give-and-take with Khrushchev.

Simpson said in a statement that Nixon's "two-listed replies" to Khrushchev's "arrogant charges and threats . . . completely confounded" the Communists.

### Chlorine House Damaged in Crash

Seaside—(UPI)—The Seaside water department chlorine mixing house about two miles south of here was demolished early Sunday in a collision between a car and a pickup truck, state police said.

The collision occurred between a car driven by Maurice Sutherland, Portland, and a pickup truck driven by H. O. Wilson, Seaside. Wilson suffered minor injuries while Sutherland and his wife escaped injury. No citations were issued.

The impact sent the truck through the chlorine house. Work on a new chlorine house was to start today.

### Nyssa Elected Head Of Oregon Legion

Salem—(UPI)—Fred Bennett, Nyssa, was elected president of the Oregon Department of the American Legion at the close of the state convention here Saturday.

Merrill Johnson, Oregon City, was elected vice commander.

Reelected finance officer was Thomas D. Stoughton, Portland, along with Karl Wagner, Eugene, who resumed his post as national executive committeeman.

Named as alternate national committeeman was Clyde Dickey, Portland.

Many Legion members attended the funeral of former Gov. Douglas McKay, who served both in World War I and II.

### Maine Indians To Get Free Licenses

Old Town, Maine—(UPI)—Descendants of the Indians who taught the white man how to hunt and fish will save wampum under the new law recently passed by the Maine legislature.

The act permits members of the Penobscot and Passamaquoddy tribes to obtain free hunting and fishing licenses for the first time since the state established hunting and fishing regulations.

Under the new law Indians will save \$2.75 a year for hunting licenses and \$2.75 for fishing permits. The act affects some 1,200 Indians, about half in each tribe. Most of the Penobscots live in their own village at Old Town.
