Dispute of Rights Gets Suggestions

Salem—(UPI)—A continuing dispute of water rights brought recommendations from Attorney General Robert Y. Thornton Thursday that "Congress face up to its responsibilities and stop encroachment by federal agencies in the field of state water law."

Thornton's statement was contained in a letter to California Attorney General Stanley Mosk who had asked Thornton's advice regarding the California-Arizona water problem. Mosk said that in the case of Arizona versus California, now pending before the U. S. Supreme Court, U. S. Attorneys are making arguments which, if accepted, would very largely take control of water rights away from the states. Thornton said he "completely disagreed" with the federal position.
