The second-place Milwaukee Braves stayed within a half-game of the lead with an 8-1 victory over the St. Louis Cardinals.

Juan Pizarro hurled a six-hitter for his fourth victory as the Braves scored their ninth victory in the last 10 games. Hank Aaron hit his 29th homer in the eighth inning to put Milwaukee ahead, 3-1, and Ed Matthews' 30th homer with two men on highlighted a five-run rally in the seventh. Andy Variopapa of bowling's Hall of Fame will show keggers here the tennpin wizardry which has carried him to his many titles when he appears on Wednesday, Aug. 5, at Medford Bowling lanes.

Variopapa, a member of the Brunswick advisory staff, will show his wares in connection with the grand opening of the Medford establishment.

The open house marks the expansion of the pin emporium to a 38 alley house.

Andy climaxed one of the most sensational careers in the tennpin sport in December of 1947 by winning the annual All-Star tournament in Chicago for the second consecutive time, averaging 210.8 in the finals.

Previously, in October, he had paired with Lou Campi to capture the national match game doubles title in Houston, making him one of the very few ever to hold both titles simultaneously.

The barrel-chested Italian broke into the headlines when he teamed with Joe Falcaro of New York in a doubles match. Andy's sensational scores in that match, including three consecutive games of 279, made him a sports headline and he has remained so ever since.

His next doubles effort netted him a 229 average for 56 games, and two subsequent matches found the little giant shooting averages of 228 for 20 games, and 225 for 21 games, respectively.

Barney Spinella, holder of three ABC titles, fell before Andy by nearly 600 pins.

One of his greatest "iron man" stunts came in 1939, when he rolled 50 games of exhibition and trick shot bowling, and still managed to average 238 for his final five games.

Andy has authored no fewer than 72 perfect (300) games and many others of 299 and 298. But just to show that he is human like all the rest of us, he ran into a dismal 109 game in the Peterson Classic several years ago.
