WHEREAS, the unregulated use of certain forest areas is, in my judgment, a menace to life and property because of weather conditions and the existence of an excessive amount of debris on the ground, and

WHEREAS, upon the showing of the State Forester, it appears to be necessary to close to unregulated use the following area designated as:

**AREA NO. 2-P—OREGON STATE FOREST OF FORESTRY SOUTHWEST OREGON DISTRICT AREA NO. 2—Prospect-Butte Falls**  
Starting at the NE corner of Sec. 3, T. 32 S., R. 3 E., W.M., and running westerly to the NW corner of Sec. 32 S., R. 3 E., thence south to the intersection of this line with Barr Creek; thence southwesterly along the south bank of Barr Creek to Mill Creek; thence southwesterly along the south bank of Mill Creek to the Rogue River; thence southwesterly along the south bank of the Rogue River to the intersection of the east line of Sec. 11, T. 33 S., R. 2 E.; thence south to the SE corner of Sec. 14, T. 34 S., R. 2 E.; thence east to the SE corner of Sec. 13, T. 32 S., R. 3 E.; thence west to the NW corner of Sec. 13, T. 32 S., R. 3 E.; thence north to the NE corner of Sec. 11, T. 32 S., R. 3 E.; thence west to the NW corner of Sec. 11, T. 32 S., R. 3 E.; thence north to the point of beginning. Permits to enter the above area may be obtained under the following places:

Prospect Guard Station  
Butte Falls Guard Station  
McLeod Guard Station  
Trail Guard Station  
State Forest Patrol Headquarters, Central Point, Oregon

**NOW THEREFORE, I, MARK O. HATFIELD, Governor of the State of Oregon,** by virtue of the authority vested in me under the provisions of ORS 477.156, do hereby proclaim the unregulated use of the above forest area to be unlawful and that said areas shall be subject to entry only through permits to be issued by the forest warden. Pursuant to ORS 477.158, the forest warden, during periods of fire hazard conditions, refuse, postpone or restrict issuance of such permits when necessary to prevent danger to life or property. The permit shall require the entrant:

- (1) Refrain from smoking except in places designated as safe in said permit.
- (2) Build no open fires except in places designated as safe in said permit.
- (3) Have as equipment when using campfires, except when traveling as a pedestrian or camping at improved, designated and posted campgrounds, tools specified by the forest warden as suitable for extinguishing fires.

This proclamation shall be effective from and after the 31st day of July, 1959, and shall remain in full force and effect until the 31st day of December, 1959.
