### Do You Like to Eat Out? Psychologist Tells Why

New York - UPI - A woman who passes up steak for a less expensive restaurant entree isn't necessarily the thrifty type.

"She may skip steak because she thinks no special talent is needed to cook it, and no unusual ingredients go into its preparation.

Several women gave this explanation in a 42-family survey made by psychologist Peter Siegle to determine why we like to eat out. The study was made in the Midwest for a national food service and restaurant chain, the John R. Thompson Co.

This yen for the unusual is one of women's main reasons for dining out, the study disclosed.

It also revealed that mothers enjoy appearing publicly with their families as a visible expression of "togetherness."

Married or single, she's mentally "taking notes" on the cooking whenever she's in a restaurant.

Even the working girls-and bachelor businessmen-follow a similar pattern, the study showed. Women consistently seek fancier restaurants and spend a disproportionate amount of their earnings for lunch, Siegle said.

Writers and waitresses questioned in the survey confirmed the suspicion that many men order the same things daily, with only slight variations. Unlike women, they
