

Caperna Continues In NW Links Open; Congdon Has Lead

Salem - (UPI) - Medford pro Ron Caperna turned in a 74 Tuesday to make it into the 36-hole finals today of the Northwest Open Golf championships. He carded a 72 Monday. Eight other golfers tied him at 146.

Jim Sheldon, amateur from Medford, was eliminated on Tuesday. He shot a 76 to go with Monday's 74 for a 150. The cutting-off place was 148.

Salem - (UPI) - Professional Chuck Congdon of Tacoma, Wash., turned in a 70 Tuesday to go with Monday's 66 and kept his lead in the 50th annual Northwest Open Golf tournament at Salem Golf club. His 136 was four-under-par.

Eddie Hogan of Portland, who tied Congdon Monday, carded a 74 Tuesday and dropped to an even-par 140.

Washington state golfers dominated the rest of the ranking field, which was trimmed to 68 players Tuesday, 40 of them professionals.

Ron Weber of Kelso, the only amateur near the top and a junior next year on the champion University of Houston team, shot 69-69-138 for second place, along with Seattle's John Hoetmer and Tacoma's Al Feldman. Hoetmer had a 68 Tuesday and Feldman a 71.

Three players tied at 139. They were Sid Harman, of Yakima, who shot a 67 Tuesday for the best single round of the day; Tom Marlowe of Portland and Cliff Whittle, Twin Falls, Idaho.

It took 148 or better to qualify for today's 36-hole final round.

Oregon Open champion Bob Duden, Portland, had 70-70-140. Ockie Eliason of Tacoma, the only man competing here who has won the title twice, had 69-73-142. Recent Washington Open winner Don Bies of Seattle stayed in with 67-77-144. Oregon PGA champion Bots Porterfield of Grants Pass had 71-73-144.

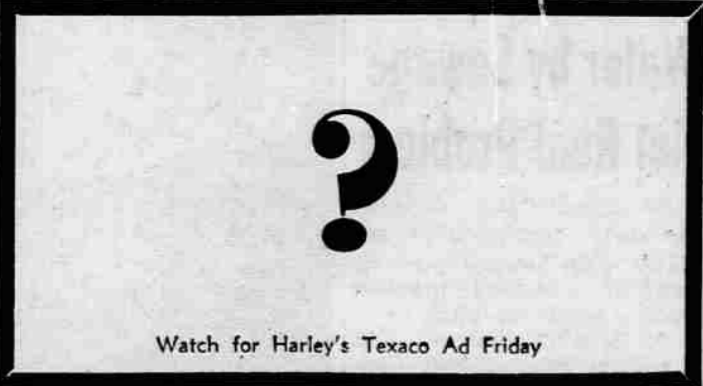
