**The Medical Roundup**

**PSORIASIS**

Hundreds of thousands of people are much distressed by psoriasis, which is a basically chronic, but occasionally acute inflammation of the skin, characterized by round, reddish patches covered by silvery white scales. These patches are a reflection on both arms or both legs, or on the scalp, or anywhere. The disease tends to involve the finger nails, and in 6 per cent of cases it affects the joints causing arthritis. Sometimes, all by itself, the disease will largely clear up, especially in the summer. In most cases the patient's general health remains unaffected. The disease appears to be hereditary, but just why the skin behaves as it does, no one yet knows.

DAVID S.—My wife and I are in our early 20's and have been married two years. We have no serious problems about marriage, but we do have one that concerns one of my best friends. **'IQ' Not Best Judge of School Pupil**

Syracuse, N.Y.—UPI—A guidance counselor says a child's "IQ" should never be the sole basis for determining if he is an exceptional student.

Miss Gertrude B. Woodward told a recent Student Personnel Conference at Syracuse university that such things as family background, vocational interests, social relationships and extra-curricular activities must also be considered. Miss Woodward, a teacher and counselor in California high schools, explained:

"If a child is intellectually well developed and yet is not mature emotionally or in social relationships beyond his grade, it would be unwise to put him ahead a grade no matter what his IQ."

**Drinking Man Gets Hobby; Then Trouble**

Buffalo, N.Y.—UPI—Louis Kellerman testified that he had a drinking problem seven years ago and was advised to take up a hobby.

"So I took up betting," Kellerman said.

Kellerman's horse activities were found to go beyond just betting. The justice of the peace in the town of Hamburg convicted him of bookmaking.

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**New Satellite Detection Noted**

West Hartford, Conn. — (Science Service) — A new method for detecting satellites whose radio transmitters are no longer operating is now available. It was devised by three "ham" radio operators. They found that each satellite builds and carries along with it a cloud of ionized particles, and that this cloud can be detected by listening to disturbances it causes in the radio transmissions of WWV. WWV is the National Bureau of Standards' broadcast station carrying standard time signals at various frequencies. Two very different types of disturbances at a frequency of 10 megacycles were found by Clay Roberts, Paul Kirchner and Dave Bray of the General Electric Company's Advanced Electronics Center, Cornell University, Ithaca, N.Y. Another effect was found at the 20 megacycle frequency, a fast flutter, similar to the familiar airplane flutter seen on TV screens.

The scientists have dubbed the two effects at 10 megacycles, "Doppler" and "Rumble." Both are audible radio tones, they report in QST, official journal for amateur radio fans published here.

The ionospheric effects have been recorded from the two sections of Sputnik III, and from the lost satellite, Discoverer I. Their project is being continued using GE facilities.
