

Rainbows Will Have Line Depth

For the first time in its history, the fleet-footed University of Hawaii Rainbows will take on a full collegiate schedule beginning with their opening game against the Southern Oregon college Red Raiders on Sept. 19.

The game will be at the Medford high stadium.

Coach Henry Vasconcellos believes that his Rainbows, against this tougher competition, will improve over their 1958 record since their depth, especially in the line, seems better. Backfield replacements still are presenting a problem, however.

Anchoring a veteran line will be Sam Foster, a veteran center and capable linebacker; Dan Iuka, three-year letterman guard; and George Naukan, glue-fingered end, who should be better than ever after a knee operation this spring.

Sparkling the backfield will be dynamic Nolan George, a classic runner with a compact 5-foot 5-inch frame, and Damon Waitley, an end who was shifted to halfback last year. He proved to be the Rainbows' top ground gainer.

Handling passing assignments will be quarterback Casper Schlichte, a freshman last year, and Clarence Nihei, an end last season who has been switched to quarter.

With 21 returning lettermen, including seven from the 1958 first team, and a passel of promising newcomers, the colorful Rainbows are tabbed to give the fans in Southern Oregon an authoritative look-see at some high kicking, pinpoint passing, rabbiy running, and some stellar defensive football.

Sponsored by the Medford Active club for charity purposes, the game gives valley fans opportunity of seeing a big-time team in action right on the home doorstep.

Two records fell in the Saturday afternoon time trials. Medford's Glen Cave gunned his '55 Studebaker to a new mark of 76.96 miles per hour in "E" stock. George Hunt, Central Point, broke his own record with a mark of 99.44 MPH in "B" modified roadster. Hunt's roadster pickup appeared to be a sure bet to top the century mark in today's running.

Time trials will open at 9 a.m. this morning and the deadline for local entries will be 11:30 a.m. Eliminations will be held following lunch.

With the emphasis on the gas classes for today's action, trophy awards are being presented in all classes and for numerous other performances.

Top Gas Class eliminator, chosen by elimination from the winners of the gas classes, will receive a 30-inch trophy plus a \$25 savings bond. Top speed recorded in the gas classes will garner a \$25 bond and all other gas class winners will take 26-inch trophies home.

By United Press International — Frank Thomas, slump-ridden all season, broke out of its long enough Saturday to hammer a three-run homer that led the Cincinnati Reds to a 9-6 victory over the National league leading San Francisco Giants.

The Giants' lead thus dwindled to one game over the Los Angeles Dodgers who play a night game with the Milwaukee Braves in Los Angeles.

Thomas' homer was off Stu Miller in the fourth inning and boosted the Reds' lead to 9-3. Orlando Cepeda, Willie McCovey, Felipe Alou and Willie Kirkland each homered to the Giants but the blows were with nobody on base.

Pete West — Orlando Pena, who worked 4 2/3 innings in relief, picked up his fourth win for the Reds while Mike McCormick suffered his 10th setback for the Giants.

The Pittsburgh Pirates scored a 4-3, 14-inning win over the Chicago Cubs when Rocky Nelson doubled home Roberto Clemente. The game played under protest by Cub Manager Bob Scheffing over a disputed play in the 14th. Don Hoak scored the Pirates' first run after a triple and then drove in two runs when they rallied in the eighth to tie the score.

The St. Louis Cardinals won a doubleheader from the last-place Philadelphia Phillies, winning the first game, 4-3, on Bob Miller's eight-hit pitching and the nightcap on Ken Boyer's 11th-inning double. Stan Musial hit a two-run homer for the big blow of the opener while Bill White's opening double and Boyer's two-base blow won the second game.

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By United Press International — Boj Turley flashed the form that made him the American league's No. 1 pitcher in 1958 Saturday when he struck out 10 batters and pitched a four-hitter that enabled the New York Yankees to beat the Kansas City Athletics, 3-0.

It was the third straight time the Yankees shut out the Athletics and the win moved them to within a half-game of the third-place Baltimore Orioles whose scheduled night game with the Cleveland Indians was rained out. A Chicago at Washington night game also was rained out.

Turley, making his first start since July 19, did not permit a runner to advance beyond second base. A crowd of 32,888 saw him lead the Yankees' annual Old-Timers day celebration saw Turley register his eighth win compared to nine losses. He had a 21-7 record last season.

Yogi Berra hit two singles and a double and Yogi Berra had two doubles to lead the Yankees' nine-hit attack on ex-teammates Johnny Kucks and Tom Sturdivant. Back-to-back doubles by Mantle and Berra put the Yankees ahead in the third inning and they added two unearned runs in the seventh with the help of a throwing error by catcher Harry Chitt.

Manager Harry Craft of the Athletics provided the big moment of the pre-game "old-timers' game" when he made a startling catch of a 350-foot drive by Joe DiMaggio. The winning run of a 2-1 Yankee "victory" over former world series foes scored on the center-fielder's over-the-head running catch—which was perhaps the best play ever made in these annual journeys down memory lane.

Rookie Gary Geiger hit his eighth homer to lead off the 10th inning and give the Boston Red Sox a 4-3 win over the Detroit Tigers in the only other A. L. game of the day. The Red Sox tied the score with three runs in the ninth on a single by Vic Wertz, a hit batsman, Dick Gernert's pinch double and Pumpsie Green's two-run single.

Paret's Boxing Future Bright Despite Loss

New York — (UPI) — Cuban Benny (Kid) Paret, a double substitute, displayed so much class Friday night while losing an unpopular split decision to Mexican Gaspar Ortega that he earned a non-title shot at welterweight champion Don Jordan.

As far as their futures are concerned, there was no actual loser in their nationally televised and broadcast 10-rounder at Madison Square Garden.

Matchmaker Teddy Brenner announced today: "Ortega will meet Florentino Fernandez of Cuba in a TV fight at the Garden, Oct. 16; and Paret will meet Don Jordan in a non-title TV 10-rounder at the Garden, Oct. 23."

Benny is not even rated among the top 10 contenders. Ortega is ranked ninth by Ring Magazine, and sixth by the NBA.

Paret, 22, a well-built and speedy, upright boxer-puncher fought Friday night as a substitute for Charley Scott of Philadelphia. Scott found he couldn't get into condition in time, after he had signed as a replacement for Cuban Florentino Fernandez, who withdrew because of a virus.

It was an excellent see-saw fight in which lanky Ortega, 28, was generally the aggressor with his wild, long-range hooking attack to body and head.

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
