The Medical Roundup

Myasthenia Gravis

At a recent symposium on myasthenia gravis a new drug, phospholine iodide, was reported to have shown promise in reducing the weakness of the patients with the disease. The report was made by D. S. Kermit, E. Osserman, Elliott S. Cohen, and Gabriel Genkins, of Mt. Sinai Hospital, New York. At the same meeting it was reported that a Paris surgeon, Dr. Andre Thevenard (who recently died) enervated a little nerve center in the neck, called the carotid sinus. He said that four patients so treated had been cured, and 10 had been helped. This worked only in young men; it did not work in women.

Baboons Have Disease Of The Arteries

As I have to keep saying in this column, every time we doctors think we know something about hardening and patchy degeneration of the arteries, along comes someone to knock our hard-won knowledge into a cocked hat. We had an idea that cholesterol was the cause, and then along came my good friends, Drs. Wexler and Miller, of the May Institute, in Cincinnati, to show that in white rats, with no change in diet, injections of the drug ACTH will quickly produce a tremendous ulceration of the arteries. Now, doctors have found that baboons, both in the wild state and in captivity, develop arterial disease like that of man, and yet live on an almost purely vegetable diet. Their blood cholesterol is very low compared with that of a normal man.

How Dangerous Are Cousin Marriages?

Recently, there appeared a valuable article by Jean Sutter, in a Paris Journal of Medical Biology. As he said, it has always been hard to find out how harmful in-breeding is in man, because to determine this one must study large numbers of families, and one must know what sort of stock is in them. Sutter studied a total of 1445 "normal" families with 4094 children, and 804 "inbred" families with 2256 children. The inbred children had to be divided into three categories, depending on the degree of relationship between the parents. The more interesting findings were that the percentage of sterile families is higher among the inbreds. A possible explanation for this may be that the inbred people feared to have children, and hence avoided this.

Oregon Judges To Attend Conference

Portland (UPI) — Charles W. Redding, justice pro tem of the Oregon Supreme Court and presiding circuit judge for Multnomah county, has been selected as a delegate to the National Conference of State Trial Judges. The national meeting will be held in Miami Beach, Fla., Aug. 24.

Genetics, An Exact Science

Most people don't like the idea that we human beings inherit our physical and mental demerits and diseases from our ancestors just as we inherit our abilities, either physical or mental. But whether we like it or not, genetics is becoming more and more an exact science. Like all the exact sciences, the law can be worked out in remarkable detail with the help of mathematics. I recently read that in Sydney, Australia, scientists at the university recently used one of the new ultra-rapid electric computers to find out exactly what would happen if certain fruit flies were bred together. The results prophesied by the computer were very close to those obtained later by experimentation.
