**Campaign Started For Safe Toys**

Chicago (UPI)—The National Safety Council has launched a campaign to make toys safer for children, setting up a toy safety committee to deal with the problem.

The committee will conduct continuing investigation into toy accidents and will cooperate with manufacturers to eliminate unsafe toys. It will also develop and disseminate information on safe toy usage.

Serving on the committee are representatives of the U.S. Public Health Service, American Medical Association, Girl Scouts, American Academy of Pediatrics, the National Safety Council and several other organizations and private companies.

The committee urges individuals as well as local, state and national organizations to send it any information they may have on unsafe toys and toy accidents.

Complaints will be investigated and forwarded to the manufacturers.

**Little Strokes**

It is curious but some neurologists and internists have to admit that for one large stroke there are probably hundreds or thousands of what I call the "little strokes," which seldom produce a paralysis or a loss of speech.

Most of the little strokes probably occur during sleep, and hence the patient has no knowledge of them, except perhaps when he wakes with a "head on him" as if he had been drinking heavily. Spells that come during the day may cause some dizziness or wooziness or nausea, which may last for an hour or two.

In some cases there remains some loss of memory, some irritability and some irascibility, some aging, some slowing-up, or some difficulty in working, ear noises, curious distresses in the head, some trouble with swallowing, a burning of the tongue, an awful taste in the mouth, a numbness somewhere, a little failure of vision, a little weakness in the legs, a pain in the face, a lack of interest or joy in living, a lack of desire to keep clean and neat, sexual impotence, Parkinson's syndrome with a poker face and a shaking hand, an inability to drive the car safely, an inability to sleep, a sudden loss of much weight, some thickness of speech, a shuffling walk, a loss of animation and strength in the face, a fear of being left alone, a tendency to cry, or some loss of refinement.

Idea Quickly Accepted

General practitioners usually quickly accept my idea of the little strokes because they see so many hundreds of patients who die slowly over the course of years with these little pluggings-up of tiny arteries in the brain.

It is sad that so many of these patients do not get any sympathy or understanding from their families. Their children may keep saying, "Oh, Father, snap out of it and quit grumping." But the poor man can't snap out of it; his brain is too seriously injured. Often he feels utterly miserable.

Rarely, a man who for years has caught the 7:45 into town every working day, wakes one morning, feeling miserable. Then, for no reason that he can give to his wife, he never goes to work again. Or, he goes to work and soon has to be retired because he has lost all his old drive, he can't get anything done, he forgets what he started to do, and perhaps he is so irritable he can't get along with his associates. Many a time a man's secretary has said to me, "Since that day when, for a moment he fell out of his chair, he hasn't been able to dictate a logical letter."

Something Terrible Known

I often have difficulty with the neurologists, because when they go over such a man with their pin and cotton and little hammer, they cannot find anything the matter with him. According to their old standard tests, he is all right; but his wife and his boss at the office know that something terrible has happened to his brain. As many a wife has said to me, "All of a sudden, my old lawyer and able husband was gone and in his place I had a chattering, someone I hardly knew." A man who had been a tower of strength in his whole family in his 60s, was asked to testify in court. On coming off the stand, after a grueling cross-examination, he stumbled and fell. Recovering himself in a moment, he went home, but immediately his family knew that a terrible change had taken place in him. He was slow-ed-up, querulous, unable to do
