ly set for Sept. 17 in Medford, on Rogue basin project plans may be delayed, he said. The directors of the Rogue River Basin Flood Control and Water Resources association requested the delay Thursday night.

Such an organization must be formed by Applegate citizens so water users who do not have prior water rights can buy water from the government, Stewart told the approximately 100 persons attending a meeting in the Upper Applegate Grange hall.

Those water users getting free water would continue to get it, he said. Construction of Copper dam would mean additional irrigation water for 9,400 acres, and 5,000 acres of land now dry would be irrigated as well, the engineer said.

Following the hearing the corps will study the testimony presented. Then a public notice would inform the public of the corps recommendations on the project to Congress, Stewart explained.

Both written and oral statements of opinion will be accepted at the hearing scheduled for Medford, Stewart said. He suggested any further questions after Friday's meeting on the proposed Copper dam should be sent to Francis Krouse, Applegate rancher and water resources association director.

Police, civil defense and Red Cross officials loaded the victims in ambulances, trucks, buses and commandeered station wagons, and took them to the town's two hospitals, the National Guard armory and a public school.

Others, felled as they drove homeward, were taken to hospitals at Elkhart and La Grange, Ind.
