

### Rookies Battle To Show Stuff In Exhibitions

National Football League rookies, desperately fighting the battle of experience against seasoned stars, reveal their talents in exhibition competition this week end.

Coach Buck Shaw of the Philadelphia will have five newcomers in the lineup against the New York Giants at Hershey, Pa., Saturday night.

Darrell Aschbacher of Oregon, a left guard, and J. D. Smith, Rice, a right guard, will start on offense. Defensive starting assignments have been handed to John Nocera, Iowa, left linebacker; Alan Miller, left wing and Art Powell, left safety.

Four Chicago Bear rookies get their chance in Saturday's pre-lighter with the Green Bay Packers at Milwaukee. Owner-coach George Halas said his starting offensive unit would include right tackle Gerald Delveca from Middle Tennessee State and right end Willard Denveall from Southern Methodist.

Rookies on the starting defensive squad will be right linebacker Rommie Loid of UCLA and left end Joe Robb of Texas Christian.

**Day With Redskins**  
Eagle Day, an all-Southern quarterback from Mississippi who spent two seasons with the Canadian pros, gets his NFL start with the Washington Redskins against the Forty-Niners in San Francisco Sunday.

Forty Niner coach Red Riskey has nominated rookie Monte Clark, former USC Trojan, to start at offensive tackle against Washington.

Los Angeles coaches will be watching television tonight as five of their prize rookies play for the College All-Stars against the Baltimore Colts in Chicago. With the All-Stars are John Guzik of Pittsburgh, Sam Williams of Michigan State, Gene Selawski, Purdue, Bob Rief-snyder, Navy and Buddy Humphreys, Baylor.

## Tigers Nip Hope For Indian Title

The Detroit Tigers dealt the Cleveland Indians' American League pennant hopes a sharp blow Saturday when they kayoed Herb Score in a five-run third inning and went on to score a 9-6 triumph over the tribe.

The Chicago White Sox thus had an opportunity to increase their first-place lead to 4½ games when they met the Kansas City Athletics in a night game. Washington was at Baltimore in another night game.

Charley Maxwell hit two homers and Gus Zernial one to lead the Tigers' 11-hit attack that brought Jim Bunning his 11th win of the season. The Indians took a quick 2-0 lead in the first inning on homers by Minnie Minoso and Tito Francona and went ahead, 4-2, in the third when Francona hit a two-run round-tripped.

The Tigers, however, struck right back to tie the score on homers by Maxwell and Zernial leading off the third inning and singles by Al Kaline and Rocky Bridges, two walks and Frank Bolling's double added three more.

**Tenth Seasonal Loss**  
The loss was the 10th of the season for Score who hasn't won a game since July 3.

The Boston Red Sox mauled three pitchers for 11 hits and received 13 walks to crush the collapsing New York

Yankees, 12-4. Catcher Sam White hit a triple and three singles to drive in four runs in a Red Sox attack featured by a six-run second inning. The Red Sox led, 12-0, before the Yankees made their first hit in the fifth inning. Frank Sullivan, relieved in the sixth by Leo Kiely, won his seventh game while rookie Eli Guba suffered his fourth defeat.

### Colts Trip Stars 29-0

Chicago (UPI) - The College All Stars' win-or-lose passing attack boomeranged, and that's the story of the Baltimore Colts one-sided, 29-0, triumph over the best of the amateurs in the annual pro-collegian football struggle.

The Colts, champions of the National Football League, Friday night tied a record for the 26-game series in intercepting five passes. One of the thefts was turned into an immediate touchdown when Milt Davis ran 36 yards into the end zone.

The other interceptions came deep in Baltimore territory, one of them in the end zone, to halt the All Stars on their few offensive thrusts across the 50-yard line.

Units Sparks Colts  
Meanwhile, the Colts' offense sparked by John Unitas, was far too sharp for the All Star defense. Unitas completed 15 of 25 passes for 211 yards and three touchdowns. He hit on touchdown throws of 29 yards to Jim Mutscheller, 13 to L. G. Dupre, and three to Ray Berry.

In rushing, gigantic Alan Ameche crashed for 61 yards, nearly three times the total yardage of 21 permitted the entire All Star squad. The Colts altogether whirled for 155 yards on the ground.

## Rawls Holds One Stroke Lead; Devoe Scores 243

Seattle, Wash. (UPI) - Betsy Rawls held a one-stroke lead over Betty Jameson when the last putt dropped Saturday in the Women's Western Open Golf tournament.

Miss Rawls of Spartanburg, S.C., and Miss Jameson of San Antonio, Tex., started Saturday's championship flight play deadlocked with 146½. Miss Rawls' total is 222.

Neither dented par in Saturday's 18 hole play over the 6,238-yard Rainier Golf and Country club. Miss Rawls came in with a 76 on rounds of 39-37. Miss Jameson had a 77 to go with earlier rounds of 71-15.

Joyce Ziske, Waterford, Wis., turned in a 75 and held a three-day total of 224 for third spot in the title fight. Miss Ziske had earlier rounds of 76-73.

Sue Devoe of Medford scored 77-83-83 for a 243 total. The three pros had a little breathing room with five golfers including amateur Jo Anne Gunderson, of Kirkland, Wash., deadlocked at 226.

**Turns in Best Round**  
Miss Gunderson, who turned in the day's best round with a 74, was bracketed with pros Louise Skuggs, Sea Island, Ga.; Beverly Hanson, India, Calif.; Mrs. Kathy Cornelius, Lakeland, Fla.; and Patty Berg, Chicago, seven time winner of this event.

Berg, Hanson and Cornelius each turned in a 76 on the third time around the 18-hole layout and Suggs came in with a 75.

Four strokes behind this bunching was Faye Crocker, pro Montevideo, Uruguay, who had a 230. She finished with a 77 Saturday to go with earlier rounds of 75-78.

Joanne Prentice, a pro from Birmingham, Ala., and Murle Mackenzie, St. Petersburg, Fla., were next in line with 231½. Miss Prentice fired a 76 Saturday and Miss Mackenzie had a 79.

Miss Rawls, within paycheck distance of breaking the all-time earning record for one year, turned gambler Saturday on the ninth hole. Her approach dropped below the green and to within six inches of a tree. A right-hander, she was unable to find swinging room.

Miss Rawls surveyed the scene carefully, turned her back to the green and batted her shot at the tree. The ball scampered about ten feet up the tree trunk, looped over and rolled to within three feet of the green.

Her chip shot had eyes and rolled in for a par four that literally caused her big gallery to explode.

Miss Rawls had banked \$19,650 on the tournament trail this year and seemed certain to break the all-time mark of \$20,235 rung up by Marlene Bauer Hagge in 1956.
